Quality mentoring programs have been shown to impact students socially, emotionally, and academically, thus creating safer, healthier, more productive citizens of our society.





Ignite Partnership Requirements

To support a school-based mentoring program as an Ignite Partner, we request engagement by 10 mentors <u>or</u> the support of at least 10 students. In some cases, we allow for growth over time.

We seek partners who can support a full school year. If beginning after November 15, we ask for a commitment through the following school year.

A Model for Mentoring Success

This information represents the best practices of Fairfax County Public Schools MentorWorks office.

Commitment for an Individual Mentor

- Mentoring takes place on school grounds during the school day or in a school sanctioned before or after-school setting.
- The time commitment is 30 minutes each week, though there is some flexibility. VIRTUAL meetings can be blended with IN-PERSON meetings, but each mentoring relationship is unique, so the balance between the two is determined on a case-by-case basis.
- Because mentors support students socially and emotionally, FCPS will strategically pair mentors and mentees. Mentors can be placed in a school convenient to where they live or work.
- When appropriate, we recommend that mentors stay with their mentees as they move from one grade to the next and to middle or high school.

Background Checks and Fingerprinting

- Mentors are required to go through the FCPS fingerprinting and background check process and FCPS mentor training prior to engaging students.
- If your organization has 5 or more potential mentors, the FCPS mobile fingerprinting unit will come to your location.

Once We've Agreed to Partner

Partner Coordinator

- Designate a mentoring point-of-contact.
- Advertise and collect contact information for new mentors.
- Connect new candidates to the FCPS MentorWorks Specialist for training and screening.

MentorWorks Specialist

- Support recruiting efforts.
- Train mentor candidates and coordinate the background check and fingerprint process.
- Connect new mentors to the school-based mentoring coordinator.
