

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Your sixth grade student discussed different types of child abuse including neglect, emotional, verbal, physical, and sexual abuse in their health education instruction this week. Students learned definitions, who to go to for help and questions, and about the importance of reporting instances of abuse.

One particular form of child exploitation that is occurring in Fairfax County is teen sex trafficking. Traffickers are using social media sites to pose as teens or interested and concerned young adults to establish a relationship and eventually meet their victims. In some cases, students are approached in public places such as malls or bus stops.
