It is my goal that the PTSA will help keep you informed and involved in the Fairfax High School community. Many studies have proven that students whose parents are involved at the high school level do better academically, socially and in athletic endeavors

The PTSA is the communication link between the school and parents. In high school the PTSA is not about fundraising! The various sports and clubs raise their own funds through booster clubs. That frees up the PTSA to concentrate its energy on other issues.

Historically the PTSA has over 200 volunteers working to support teachers, staff and students. Activities that the PTSA supported last year were recognition events celebrating students' academic successes and appreciation events for teachers and staff. We also helped out with Rebel Roundup, proctored AP exams, decorated for Prom, did vision screening for 10th graders, shelved library books and assisted the staff in the Career Center, Student Services and Main Office – to name a few! The PTSA operates on a yearly budget of about \$10,000. We spend only what we make, and most of our revenue comes from membership dues. The PTSA has regular meetings, open to all, on the third Monday of each month. Our first meeting will be on Monday, September 15 from 7-8 pm in the Fairfax High School Library. Ann Voss, our new librarian, will be the featured speaker. Her talk will be followed by a short business meeting. Because each PTSA meeting is attended by the Principal and at least two teachers it is a great place to hear about upcoming events at school and to get questions

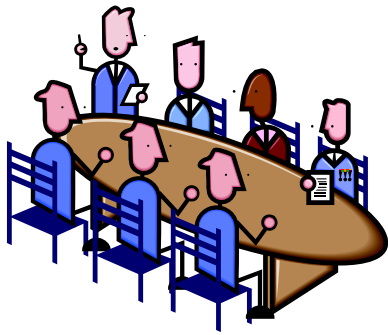

Athletic Boosters

Most find it hard to believe that zero percent of our school budget is allocated for athletics. The monies used to fund uniforms, equipment, awards, coaching clinics and stadium enhancements are all raised through the athletic department with the help of the FHS Athletic Booster Program.

The FHS Athletic Booster Club is a group of parents and other concerned community members whose mission is to enrich FHS athletic programs and the community at large by providing financial support for FHS athletics. The Athletic Boosters believe that participation in high school athletics benefits everyone, and the program promotes opportunities to build and strengthen relationships and school spirit among the student body, the Fairfax staff, parents and the community.

This group of concerned community members helps provide support for over 40 athletic teams. The athletic program at Fairfax is funded from booster run concession sales, advertising and sponsorships, spirit wear and gate receipts. Information regarding the athletic boosters and the FHS athletic program can be found on the FHS athletic website – www.fairfaxhighsports.org. All team and game related information is posted to this site.

You can help support our student athletes by purchasing an Athletic Booster pass. These passes are good for ALL Regular season HOME sporting events – they are not recognized for end of season tournament play or “special events”. Entry to all regular season contests is \$5.00. The athletic booster pass program allows you to purchase passes (at varying levels) which can save you money and raise funds for the athletic program at the same time.

FHS Family Plan - \$210 (includes FOUR single person passes)

FHS Two-Person Plan - \$150 (includes TWO single person passes)

FHS Individual Supporter - \$90 (includes ONE single person pass)

FHS Student Pass - \$50 (includes ONE student – 18 yrs and under)

The Athletic Boosters are happy to accept donations in any amount and welcome your active participation. Any pass holder is considered an active member of the athletic booster club. The Athletic Boosters meet on the second Monday of the month in the classroom off of the field house lobby.
