The focus of the Behavior Supports (PBS) is to provide a clear and consistent system of expected behaviors for the entire school. While many staff members and students know what behaviors are acceptable at school, we cannot assume that everyone's beliefs are the same.

Floris Cafeteria

Students are expected to remain seated, use good table manners, speak nicely and quietly and use “please”, “thank you”, and “you’re welcome”. Please help your child master cafeteria expectations by practicing them at family meals.

Hallway, Lobby And Playground



During the school day, students are expected to move silently through the red zones so as not to disturb others who are learning. Students should stay to the right to allow traffic to flow smoothly. During arrival and dismissal, we practice ‘yellow zone’ behavior. ‘Green zone’ behavior is practiced on the playground outside.

Restrooms



Students are expected to efficiently use the restrooms, wash hands, and quickly return from where they were dismissed.
