

- ❑ Set a regular time everyday for homework
- ❑ Provide a space for homework that is well-lit and quiet
- ❑ Provide papers, pencils and other supplies needed to do homework assignments
- ❑ Make sure the TV/iPod/computer is turned off while your child is doing homework
- ❑ Know what your child's homework assignments and requirements
- ❑ Stay in touch with your child's teacher and contact him/her with any concerns or questions

Homework Behavior Point System

If homework time is a battle, use a point system.

For example:

- Neat - 1 point**
- Complete - 1 point**
- Correct - 1 point (aim for 80 - 90% accuracy, does not have to be perfect)**
- No Complaining - 1 point**
- Starting at the designated time - 1 point**
- Reward accumulated points w/ "screen time".**
