Here are some things to remember about a bibliography:

- The heading on your bibliography page may be Bibliography or Works Cited.
- Your bibliography is a list of all of the sources that you use for a report or project.
- If the author is not given for a source, just leave it out and start with the title.
- List your sources in alphabetical order by the first word of the entry. If the first word is A, An, or The, use the second word to alphabetize.
- Make sure you follow the correct pattern for each source.
- Skip a line between each entry.
- Your bibliography should be the last page of your report.
