

General Information

Purpose

Intersessions offer additional learning time in the areas of language arts, math, technology, science, social studies, the arts, and physical education. Intersession classes offer reinforcement and enrichment for Franconia students and are aligned with the Virginia Standards of Learning. **Participation is optional but highly recommended for all students!** Each student can sign up to attend all day by selecting two classes each intersession. Parents may elect to have their child attend only the morning or afternoon session. Students can also use the intersession for family time.

Schedule

The student day begins and ends at the regular time.

Participation

All students at Franconia are eligible to attend intersession. Invitations are issued for classes marked **. Students are expected to participate in all class activities.

Dates: Wednesday, March 10 through Monday, March 15, 2010.

All students must return the registration form! Students should return the form to their classroom teacher.

Registration ends Monday, March 15, 2010.

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER MONDAY, March 15, 2010.

Intersession Fee

There is **no fee** for students to attend intersession.

Class Placement

Students must provide a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choice for both the morning and afternoon sessions. If the child's first choice is full, he/she will be placed in the next choice that is available. Students that are attending intersession and have been invited to a class due to a specific academic need but have not accepted the invitation may still be placed in the invitation class due to space issues. Some popular classes will be closed after the first day. If we have more students register for a particular class than class size allows, a "lottery" will be held. **Students who turn in their registration form on the first day have a better chance of receiving their first class choice.**



Transportation



Transportation will be provided for students who normally ride the bus. There will be **no mid-day bus transportation** for any grade level. Parents who choose to send their children to only a morning class are responsible for picking them up at 12:10 p.m. (10:50 a.m. on Mondays) and **signing them out** in the front office. If a child is participating in only the afternoon session the parent is responsible for providing transportation for their child to school. The child should arrive at 12:10 p.m. for the afternoon session (10:50 a.m. on Mondays) and **sign in** at the front office.

As during the regular school year, if students are to go home with another student, or be picked up by someone else, the office must receive a note from both sets of parents.

Meals

SACC

SACC (School Age Child Care) will be available for students who are already enrolled in the SACC program. The SACC program will operate the same as during the regular school day. Attendance

Students are expected to attend all classes and to arrive for each class on time.

Discipline

Excellent Franconia behavior is expected. Franconia rules and expectations are followed as stated in the Student Responsibilities and Rights handbook. Attending intersession classes is a privilege that students earn and maintain by participating in class, exhibiting appropriate behavior, and doing their best. Students who disrupt the learning process will be referred to Mrs. Morgan-Hale, Intersession Coordinator. If it becomes necessary, students will be removed from the program. Alternative programs are not available during intersession.
