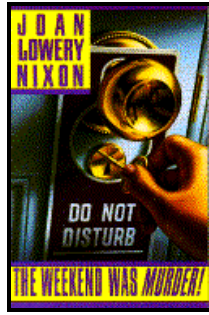

Platt	<b>A Mystery for Thoreau</b>	In 1846 Concord, Massachusetts, sixteen-year-old Oliver Puckle, a reporter for his uncle's newspaper, investigates a woman's murder, aided by the tracking skills of his Algonquin friend, Charley Bigbow, and the deductive skills of Henry David Thoreau.
Pullman, P.	<b>The Ruby in the Smoke</b>	In nineteenth-century London, sixteen-year-old Sally, a recent orphan, becomes involved in a deadly search for a mysterious ruby.
Pullman, P.	<b>Shadow in the North</b>	In 1878 in London, Sally, now twenty-two and established in her own business, and her companions Frederick and Jim try to solve the mystery surrounding the unexpected collapse of a shipping firm and its ties to a sinister corporation called North Star.

Raskin, E.	<b>The Westing Game</b>	The mysterious death of an eccentric millionaire brings together an unlikely assortment of heirs who must uncover the circumstances of his death before they

		can claim their inheritance.
Reger	<b>Emily the Strange</b>	Emily the Strange has lost her memory and finds herself in the town of Blackrock with nothing more than her diary, her slingshot, and the clothes on her back.
Reis, K.	<b>Riddle of the Prairie Bride</b>	In 1878, twelve-year-old Ida Kate and her widowed father welcome a mail-order bride and her baby to their Kansas homestead, but Ida Kate soon suspects that the bride is not the woman with whom Papa has corresponded
Richardson, E.	<b>Intruders</b>	Soon-to-be stepbrothers, Joel and Tim, start having the same nightmare after moving into a old house, they decide to investigate its source and the many other strange occurrences in their new home.

Stengel, J.	<b>Mystery of the Island Jewels</b>	On a cruise to Martinique with her distant father and her new stepfamily, fourteen-year-old Cassie encounters a mystery involving an attractive boy, his family's dark secret, the ghost of an Arawak Indian maiden, and a long-lost jeweled statue of Jesus.
Strickland, B.	<b>Hand of the Necromancer</b>	Thirteen-year-old Johnny Dixon and his friend Professor Childermass battle an evil wizard for possession of a bewitched hand which can be used to rule the world.
