What is PBS?

PBS is a process for creating safer and more effective schools. PBS is a systems approach to enhancing the capacity for schools to educate all children by developing research-based, school wide, and classroom discipline systems. The process focuses on improving a school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students. Rather than a prescribed program, PBS provides systems for schools to design, implement, and evaluate effective school-wide classroom, non-classroom, and student specific discipline plans.

What does PBS include?

- All students, staff and in all settings
- Non-classroom settings within the school environment
- Individual classrooms and teachers
- Individual student supports for the estimated 1-5% of students who present the most challenging behaviors

PBS Incentives

Eagle Tickets

Eagle tickets are given to students who are caught showing respect for themselves, others, and/or school property. An Eagle Ticket can be given by any staff member to any student. After a ticket is earned it goes into one of the boxes found around the building. On Fridays a drawing is held and one child per classroom will win a free dessert in the cafeteria. The child's picture will be posted outside the classroom for the week on a red and black star. At the end of each month, the class who collected the most Eagle Tickets out of the whole grade level will win a class prize of a popcorn party, cupcakes, a cake, etc. The winning class will get to eat lunch on the stage adjoining the cafeteria.
