

After School Activities

Activities are available to our students based on the availability of facilitators and space.

ARCHERY (COMING IN THE SPRING) - This activity will be open to 8th graders following the introductory portion of the P.E unit on Archery. (COACH WALLACE & COACH CAUTHORN WILL BE THE FACILITATORS FOR THIS ACTIVITY)

ARTS & CRAFTS (WEDNESDAYS)- Come join Ms. Howell in the cafeteria as she provides fun, creative and engaging projects such as designing friendship bracelets and personalized handbags.

ART CLUB (MONDAYS)- Mr. Guthrie and Ms. Woznica are looking for students who are truly interested in committing to

ART STUDIO (WEDS & THURS) - Come draw, paint, sculpt, and design under the guidance of Mr. Guthrie and Mrs. Woznica.

BADMINTON (MON, WEDS, THURS) – Students can play free play or competitive formats of 1-on-1 or 2-on-2. This activity will be offered from time-to-time based on the availability of space in our Main or Aux Gyms.

BASKETBALL (MON-FRI) – Students work with the JEB Stuart Varsity Basketball staff learning fundamental skills while participating in structured team and free play activities. Stuart Coaches are available Mon, Wed, & Thur afternoons until HS Basketball begins in November. They will resume following the conclusion of the season in late February or early March depending on the success of the season.

BOARD GAMES (MON-FRI) - Students enjoy socializing and playing games including: Chess, Monopoly, Life, Connect 4, UNO, Mancala, Scrabble, Taboo, etc...Games help to stimulate conversation and to promote friendly interaction between students.

CHEERLEADING (MON, WED, THUR-COMING IN NOVEMBER) - Students will work with a member of the JEB Stuart Cheerleading staff to learn fundamental principles and cheer routines. This activity will become available in November when Ms. Carr concludes the most demanding part of her Cheer responsibilities at JEB.

COLLEGE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM (LAST WEDS OF EACH MONTH) – This program is designed to increase the number of first generation college applicants and minority student's knowledge and understanding of higher education programs and opportunities. Students that have been invited to participate in this program will work with Mrs. Saunders 2-3 times per month.

COMMUNITY SERVICE CLUB (MONDAYS) – Students work with Ms. Peters on ways to give back to our school, community, and world while earning community service credit.

COOKING CLUB (MON, WED, THURS)- Students learn how to operate safely in a kitchen while creating quick-healthy snacks and meals.

DIAMOND DREAMS (THURSDAYS-10/1-10/22)- The Diamond Dreams Foundation is non-profit organization with an interest in revitalizing baseball interest in our communities. This 4wk program was offered to 40 Glasgow Students for this year and all 40 spots were filled. The program receives support from former baseball players and personnel and is run in a

2hr/session clinic format. All supplies and materials will be provided including a free glove, hat, and autographed baseball upon completion of the program.

DJ CLUB (MON, WEDS, THUR-Spring) – Learn from our own in house professional DJ, Mr. Sameey, as he introduces equipment. This club will be available in a limited capacity for this year and will likely resume in the spring.

ENERGY ROCKS PROGRAM (TUES & FRI) – This program will take place in 8 wk cycles beginning at the start of the after school program in September. It will be facilitating by staff from the Dept. of Community and Recreation Services (CRS) and will target promoting healthy life style habits and choices through guided fitness activities and the preparation of healthy snacks.

FLAG-FOOTBALL (M-F) – Now that our fields are available for school related use we will begin to offer Flag-Football on a more consistent basis. This activity is not conducive to our available indoor space during late bus days when we are running additional activities concurrently within our Main Gym.

GEMS (GIRLS ENGINEERING MATH AND SCIENCES) - Designed to get 7th and 8th grade girls interested in math, science and engineering. The program's science, technology, engineering and math related activities are designed and run by members of the Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology GEMS. (See Mr. Leonard for more details). We have now located sponsors for this club and a Interest Meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 21st in room E-207. (Mrs. Schrage and Ms. Benjamin)

GOLF (MON, WEDS, THURS) – Students will have the opportunity to work with a former Division-1 golfer and to learn the basic rules and principles of the game golf through putting, chipping, and driving. We have stations that are designed for indoor and outdoor use that focus on putting, chipping, and driving as well as youth sized clubs for right and left-handed students.

HIP-HOP DANCE TEAM (MONDAY, WEDNESDAYS, THURSDAYS) – Students learn and create choreographed dance routines.

JUGGLING (THURSDAYS) – Juggling will be available from time-to-time on Thursday afternoons with Mr. Bynum. Currently, Mr. Bynum is looking to get his Videography Club off the ground on Thursdays and so Juggling will be made available periodically. As a professional juggler Mr. Bynum is able to develop beginners and to push the abilities of intermediate and advanced jugglers.

LEGO LEAGUE (COMING IN SPRING) – Lego League is a robotics competition in which school based teams construct, calibrate, test, and manipulate robots to efficiently complete tasks and challenges. We are currently in the process of looking for a new facilitator for this activity.

MOBILE TEAM CHALLENGE (TUES & FRI) - Mobile Team Challenge is a combination of activities that simulate low ropes course exercises. These physically and mentally challenging activities are designed to promote teamwork, effective communication, and leadership development. This activity is guided by the Community and Recreation Services staffs.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS (THURSDAYS) - Are you interested in international issues? Would like to help come up with solutions to ending global poverty, world hunger and developing peaceful solutions to conflicts in the world? Well then the Model United Nations is for you! (See Mr. Bermudez, Mr. Malinosky, or as your Civics or Social Studies teacher for additional info.

MUSIC APPRECIATION AND CREATIVE WRITING (THURSDAYS-COMING SOON!) – Join Mr. Holloway as he shares his experiences as a Classical, Gospel, and Opera singer while discussing components of musical and literary compositions.

ODYSSEY OF THE MIND (AS ANNOUNCED) - “Odyssey of the Mind is an international educational program that provides creative problem-solving opportunities for students from kindergarten through college. Kids apply their creativity to solve problems that range from building mechanical devices to presenting their own interpretation of literary classics. They then bring their solutions to competition on the local, state, and World level. Thousands of teams from throughout the U.S. and from about 25 other countries participate in the program.” -from www.odysseyofthemind.com. PACING PANTHERS GIRLS RUNNING CLUB (MON & WEDS)- This club provides an opportunity for students to work with and run 3 of our female instructional staffs in preparation for a 5k run in the spring. The Club focuses on fitness based concepts such cardiovascular strength and endurance, while also providing opportunities to apply and tie-in Math and Science related concepts to running.

PEER MEDIATION (MONDAYS) - Students learn skills and strategies to mediate conflicts between others with the goal of serving the student body as peer mediations. Mr. Bynum and Mrs. Winston help to recruit and train students interested in this opportunity.

PING-PONG (MON-FRI) – Students can enjoy playing and conversing with their friends in 1-on-1 and 2-on2 formatted play.

RENZULLI LEARNING SYSTEMS (THURSDAYS-MUST BE REGISTERED FOR LAB USAGE BY ONE OF YOUR TEACHERS) –Students can utilize this online learning tool to access over 20,000 education based websites. Student develop a personalized learning profile which assist the program in selecting sites that are reflective of each individual student’s interest.

SCIENCE OLYMPIAD (APPLICATION PROCESS-MEETINGS MONDAYS AND WEDNESDAYS) - The Science Olympiad competition is overseen by an international nonprofit organization devoted to improving the quality of science education, increasing student interest in science and providing recognition for outstanding achievement in science education by both students and teachers. SOCCER (M-F) –Students have an opportunity to work with several of the staffs from the JEB Stuart Varsity soccer teams to learn fundamental team concepts and to develop an understanding of the expectations of a high school athlete .

STEP/HIP-HOP TEAM (MON & WEDS) – Students will work to develop routines through creative choreography and teamwork under the supervision of Ms. Brevard.

TENNIS (MON, WEDS, THURS-DEPENDANT ON WEATHER AND AVAILABILITY OF STAFF) – Students will have the opportunity to participate in free-play and skill development activities under the supervision of Coach Cauthorn.

THE GLASGOW NEWSPAPER CLUB (COMING SOON!) – We are currently searching for a sponsor to help support Mrs. Peters in the development of our own in-house publication.

VIDEO GAME CLUB (M-F) – Students play multi-player games on several systems including: Nintendo Wii, XBOX 360, and PS2. Games include Rockband, Guitar Hero, Sport, and age approved strategy games.

VOLLEYBALL (TUES & FRI) – Students learn fundamental skill sets through free and team play. We currently have Varsity Soccer and Basketball coaches supporting our program and with minimal activity space available we hope to increase the availability of Volleyball once our outdoor spaces become accessible.

WEIGHT TRAINING (M-F) - Students can take advantage of cardio and resistance equipment to participate in circuit training. 6th grade students are not permitted to participate in weight room related activities because of safety concerns related to disruptions in growth patterns and experience. Weight room usage is not part of the 6th grade Health and P.E curriculum.
