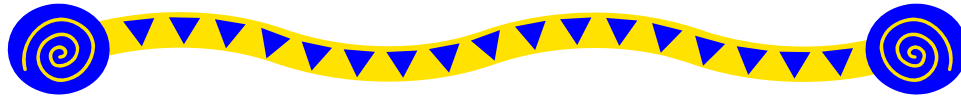

Adults and Children Together—Against Violence

ACT—is an **effective parenting/violence prevention program** that focuses on adults who raise, care for, and teach children ages 0 to 8 years. It is designed to prevent violence by providing young children with positive role models and environments that teach nonviolent problem-solving.

PRIMARY CONCEPTS

Adults serve as important **role models** for teaching young children about violence prevention.

The early years are an important time for children to learn basic skills that which can have a lasting impact on their lives.
