DAYTIME TEMPERATURES: -10° F - 105° F Record cold temp.- -80°F Record warm temp. 115° F

NIGHTTIME TEMPERATURES: -60° F - 0° F

ANNUAL RAINFALL: 100" in the month of February, no rainfall March-January (extreme drought conditions)

WIND: Mid February and April continual 70 mph winds, no air movement May-February

NATURAL DISASTERS: volcanoes, hurricanes, tornadoes, earthquakes, tsunamis, drought

volcano season: May-two active volcanoes have been spotted, many inactive (see pictures)

hurricane season: February (see pictures)

tornado season: Mid February and April -three tornadoes have been recorded by the satellite (see pictures)

earthquake season: September, October, November

tsunami season: late February

drought season: May-January

HOURS OF SUNLIGHT PER DAY: 12-18 hours

RESOURCES AVAILABLE: water in the month of February, oxygen, nitrogen, natural gases, and coal are available in abundant supply, minimal plant life during the month of February, March, and April before drought season

HABITATS: lakes and rivers during rainy season, mountains, deserts cover the surface during drought season, no forests seen, no oceans or rain forests

INHABITANTS: small unknown life forms have been spotted crawling on the surface

OTHER: There are available landing sites for exploration vehicles. Fires were visible on the surface, following lightning storms.
