- in northern hemisphere
- Atlantic Ocean to east and Pacific Ocean to west, Arctic Ocean to the north
- 17 countries including the United States of America

United States of America

- 50 states
- rivers: James, Mississippi and Rio Grande
- mountain ranges: Appalachian in the east, Rockies in the west
- large bodies of water: 5 Great Lakes

Symbols: American flag, bald eagle, Statue of Liberty, Washington Monument, Pledge of Allegiance
Virginia state bird-cardinal

Native Americans

- Eastern Woodlands-Powhatan-wood or bark houses called wigwams or long houses, fished, farmed, hunted, used canoes and walked
- Plains-Sioux-tepees, hunters, horsemen, warriors, used horses and walked
- Southwest-Pueblo or Hopi-apartment-like, multi story adobe homes, farmers, walked

Africa

- mostly in the southern hemisphere
- equator and prime meridian run through Africa
- Atlantic Ocean on the west, Indian Ocean on the east, Mediterranean Sea to the north
- 53 countries including Egypt

Ancient Egypt:

- ruled by pharaohs, laws were passed down by pharaohs
- inventions: paper made from papyrus, 365 day calendar based on the sun and the clock
- Pyramids and Sphinx
- farmers traded on the Nile River
- scribes used hieroglyphics to record events
