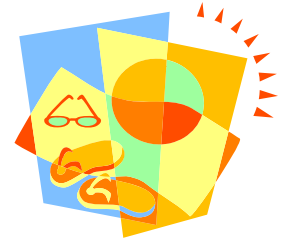




# Summer Reading Assignment 2009

### **Fiction**

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2. Describe the main character of your book in 2-3 sentences. Be as specific as you can in your word choice.  
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3. Describe the main conflict (problem) of your book in 2-3 sentences. Be as specific as you can in your word choice.  
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4. Describe the resolution (how the main conflict was solved) of your book in 2-3 sentences. Be as specific as you can in your word choice.  
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### **Nonfiction**

1. Describe why you chose your topic. What interest/knowledge did you have before you read? Be as specific as you can in your word choice. 2-3 sentences.  
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2. Summarize the main idea of your topic/subject. Be as specific as you can in your word choice. 2-3 sentences.  
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3. Describe 2-3 interesting or surprising facts you learned about your topic/subject. Be as specific as you can in your word choice. 2-3 sentences.  
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4. Describe the type of reader (audience) who might also want to read about your topic/subject. Be as specific as you can in your word choice. 2-3 sentences.  
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
