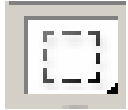


How to Change Colors in Pictures

Step 1– Import your photo from an existing file.



Marquee Tool

Step 2– Select the tool you want to use to outline your photo, for example the Magic Wand, from the tool bar.



Magic Tool

Step 3– Select Channel Mixer by going to Image -> Adjustments.



Lasso Tool

Step 4– Select desired color, then select Apply.

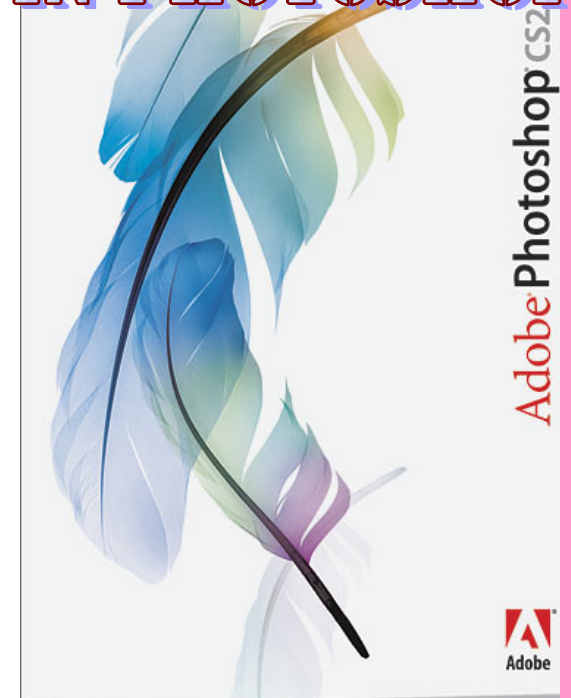


Glossary

- * **Channel Mixer:** A tool that changes colors on a selected portion of a picture.
- * **Spot Healing Brush:** A tool that helps erase flaws in an image.
- * **Magic Wand:** A tool used to select sections in the image that are the same hue/shade of color.
- * **Internet Banner:** A digital picture that has text overlaying it. Commonly used as a link back to a sight, or as a title for a story, posted in several parts, on the Internet.

Introduction

- * Adobe Photoshop is a program that allows you to change the sharpness of pictures.
- * You can change the colors on your photo, crop the pictures to a specific place, and overlay text to make a banner for the Internet.
- * The uses of Photoshop are numerous, but this brochure will focus on the color-changing aspects of Photoshop.

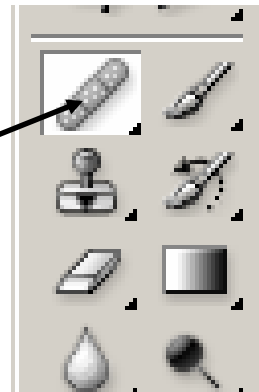
Adobe Photoshop Features

- * **Multiple layer control:**
Select and then move, group, transform, warp, or align pictures.
- * **Spot healing brush:**
Retouch photos, including 16-bit images, with this tool.
- * **One click red eye correction:**
When you have a picture with red eyes, select Channel Mixer and adjust it to 0% red and 50% green.

How to Overlay Text

- * **Step 1:** Select picture with T-shaped text tool.
- * **Step 2:** Type the wording that is appropriate to the use of the image.
- * **Step 3:** On the upper tool bar, select the black square.
- * **Step 4:** Change selection to the desired color.
- * **Step 5:** Change font size and where the text will overlay on the picture.
