Learn from a peer in your class.**

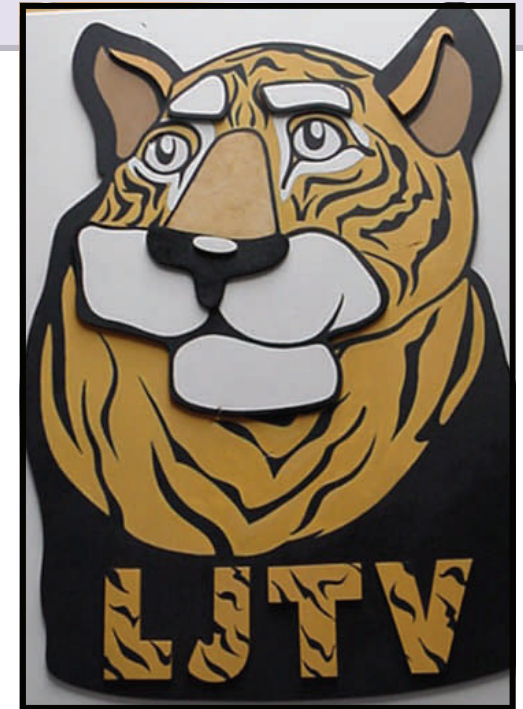
Maintain a positive attitude.

LJTV STUDIO DEMEANOR

Every morning at LMS, the M2P students broadcast the *Good Morning Middle Show* live. Sometimes, the show runs smoothly, while other times things happen and it's more challenging to produce the show perfectly. **We always face the possibility of technical and human complications!**

To run the show smoothly, every M2P student needs to work together as one production team! We need to know how to do our jobs well. Always remember to pull the show elements together efficiently.

We also need to demonstrate what we call our "LJTV Demeanor." Demeanor in the studio is how we present ourselves by our behavior, manners, and appearance. How we produce a TV show demonstrates our character qualities and values.

The way we do our jobs shows we responsibly represent ourselves, the M2P program, and our school. On LJTV, we have the opportunity to positively influence each other. We are role models.

GMJM Show Procedures

Here are the tasks for a typical GMJM broadcast

1. Arrive in the studio at 7:35 a.m. or as soon as your bus arrives. Leave directly from the bus. Do not go to your locker first, unless you arrive earlier than 7:35 a.m.
2. Say good morning to Ms. Holst.
3. Place your backpacks on the black boxes in Room 419.
4. Go into the LJTV studio.
5. Sign in on the attendance sheet.
6. Fill out a pass for your first class, and put it in a safe place.
7. Choose a job. Select a different job every day.
8. Review the job before the show begins.
9. Teach your job to your peers. Do that job as part of the production team during the broadcast.
10. If you are anchoring, put on your microphone, review your script, and listen to the anchor director for direction. Follow all cues. Smile!!
11. Clean up. Do not leave details for others. Be a leader.
12. Get your stuff from room 419, go to your lockers, and then, go to class right away. Be quiet in the hall.

Peer Teaching the 7th Grade

M2P Students

In M2P, the Grade 8 students peer teach the Grade 7 M2P students how to run the studio and perform all the jobs.

To make sure the Grade 7s have a successful hands-on learning experience, always remember to do the following—

- * Greet them politely with a smile and make eye contact. Exchange first names.
- * Take them to a job location. The primary jobs are audio mixer, cameras, primary mixer, PowerPoint, anchors director, music, and TV volume control.
- * Let them know that they can ask questions at any time.
- * Always answer their questions fully. Use a friendly voice.
- * If the Grade 7 students do not understand what they have to do, explain it to them as many times as they need it.
- * Be patient.
- * Show confidence in your teaching, and smile.
- * Show the students how to turn off the equipment and put chairs, mics, etc away.

Since the Grade 8 peer teacher demonstrates the job and then lets the Grade 7 student do it hands-on during the live show, teach them well!

Practicing these good habits, and LJTV studio demeanor, will make any 7th Graders feel welcome and comfortable—and they will want to be role models, too!!
