

People in a Setting Photography

When you take your picture, you want to make sure you are close enough to the person (also known as the subject) so the subject seems important and is not lost in the scenery. You want to capture just enough of the setting to tell a little about the person.

There are two types of people pictures—one where the subject or subjects are aware of the camera, and another where they are not aware and seem not to notice it. This type of photography creates a feeling of belonging or not belonging.

Basic Photography

Photography is the art of capturing an image to keep so you can come back later and remember what was happening.

Shutter is a mechanical part of a camera that opens and closes the lens aperture to expose the film plate to light. That's kind of confusing, but just remember—when you are using the shutter, hold the camera still to avoid a blurry photo.

The **point of view** is the angle and place where you shoot your picture. When you are taking a picture, it is always a good idea to take the picture from different points of view, to see which you like the best.

Landscape Photography

When we visit a new landscape, our eyes focus on certain things we like, and ignore less important things. When you take a picture, you need to focus on the things you like and not capture the less important things.

When you capture the things that are important it will help you to capture the feel of the landscape you visited, so you can remember it forever.



This photo captures certain features such as the rocks and trees with the ocean in the background. This photo is a good example of capturing the important features.
