Television or Radio Broadcast:

Format:

“Title of Episode or Segment.” *Title of Program*. Name of Network. Call letters, City of Local Station, Broadcast date. Medium of reception (Television or Radio).

Example:

“Science in a Day.” *NOVA*. PBS. WGBH, Boston, 2 Feb. 2010. Television.

Sound Recording:

Sound recording from a CD:

Format:

Last Name, First Name of Artist. “Song Title.” *CD Title*. Name of Manufacturer, Year of Issue.
Medium of Publication.

Example:

Ronstadt, Linda. “Love is a Rose.” *Greatest Hits*. Elektra/Asylum Records, n.d. CD.

MP3 Sound Recording:

Format:

Last Name, First Name of Artist. “Song Title.” *CD Title*. Name of Manufacturer, Year of Issue.
Medium of Publication.

Example:

Harris, Emmylou. “Moon Song.” *All I Intended to Be*. Nonesuch, 2008. MP3.

Sound recording from Soundzabound:

Format:

Last Name, First Name of Artist. “Song Title.” *Soundzabound Music Library*. Year of Issue.
Version (if needed). Medium of Publication.

Example:

Rivera, Ashley. “Don’t Stop the Rain.” *Soundzabound Music Library*. n.d. 2 min. 51 sec. vers.
MP3 file.

Film or Video Recording:

Format:

Title. Director’s Name. Other relevant person. Original Release Date. Distributor, Release Date.

Media type.

Example:

Lord of the Flies. Dir. Peter Brook. 1963. Home Vision, 1993. Videocassette.

Performance:

Format:

Title. Director's Name. Name of Theater, City. Performance Date. Performance.

Example:

Suburbia. Dir. Eric Bobosian. Third Stage Theater, Des Moines. 2 Jan. 2010. Performance.

Work of Art:

Format:

Last Name, First Name of Artist. *Title of Artwork*. Date of Artwork. Medium of Composition.

Institution, City where artwork is located.

Example:

Leibovitz, Annie. *William S. Burroughs*. 1993. Photograph. National Portrait Gallery,

Washington, D.C.

Images from the Web:

Format:

Last Name, First Name of Artist. *Title*. Date. Institution where the work is housed (if known),

City of institution (if known). Name of website or database. Medium of Publication. Date

of Access.

Example:

Loengard, John. *The Beatles: Paul McCartney, George Harrison, John Lennon & Ringo Starr of*

the Beatles, taking a dip in a swimming pool. Feb. 1964. *LIFE Photo Archive Hosted by*

Google. Web. 16 Nov. 2009.

Personal Interview:

Format:

Last Name, First Name of Person Interviewed. Interview type. Day Month Year of interview.

(**Note:** Some interview types include *Personal, Telephone, E-mail, Videoconference, Letter, Text message, IM, etc.*)

Example:

Godwin, Doris Kearns. Telephone interview. 30 Oct. 2009.

Cartoon or Comic Strip:

Format:

Last Name, First Name of Cartoonist. "Title of Cartoon or Comic Strip." Descriptive label of

Cartoon or Comic Strip. *Name of Newspaper, Magazine or Book* Day Month Year: page

Number. Medium.

Example:

Trudeau, Garry. "Doonesbury." Comic Strip. *The Washington Post* 12 March 2010: C2. Print.

Map or Chart:

Format for a print copy:

Last Name, First Name of Author/Creator (if known). "Title of Map/Chart." State either Map or

Chart. *Name of Book*. By (type in this word) First Name Last Name. Publication City:

Publisher, copyright year. Page number. Print. (type in this word)

Example:

"Groups at Risk of Genocide, Early 2005." Map. *World at Risk: A Global Issues Sourcebook*. By

CQ Press. 2nd ed. Washington, D.C.: CQ, 2010. 673. Print.

Format from a webpage:

Last Name, First Name of Author/Creator (if known). "Title of Map/Chart." State either Map or

Chart. *Title of Web site*. Publisher or sponsor of Web site; if not available, use, N.p.,

Date of Publication (day, month, year); if nothing is available, use n.d. Medium of

Publication (Web). Date of access.

Example:

"Maplewood, New Jersey." Map. *Google Maps*. Google, 15 May 2008. Web. 15 May 2008.

General Website MLA Rules:

Author:

Author or Authors (see the model author(s) under **Print Copies**). “Article Title.” Title of the overall website (italicized). Version or Edition only if stated. Publisher or sponsor of the website (if not available use N.p.). Date of the article or publication, (day, month, and year); if not available, use *n.d.* The word Web. then date of access (day, month, year).

No Author:

“Article Title.” Title of the overall website (italicized). Version or Edition. Publisher or sponsor of the website. Date of the article or publication (day, month, and year); if not available, use *n.d.* The word Web. and the date of access (day, month, year)

URLs are at the discretion of the teacher.

General MLA Rules:

Alphabetize your list.

Double space and indent if your citation is more than 1 line.

Each citation must have either the word “Print” (*at the end of the citation*) or for electronic citations the word “Web” before the date of access.
