



Head to Roll  
More - Guilty of Treason

Sir Thomas More, former chancellor for His Royal Highness King Henry VIII, was found guilty of treason by the high court. His execution by beheading has been scheduled for July 6.

As the son of a Judge Sir John More, Thomas was given the best education available. He studied under the Archbishop of Canterbury and at Oxford. In 1498 he was admitted to the lawyers guild, Lincoln's Inn. Our most noble King appointed Thomas a chancellor to the Royal Court in 1517.

When the Pope would not grant a divorce to our King, our most virtuous King started to confront the church. More, citing poor health, resigned from service to the King and returned to private life.


When Parliament passed an act declaring the King's marriage to Anne Boleyn to be against God's law all loyal citizens took an oath supporting our King and Parliament; More refused to take this oath. He was taken to the Tower of London for questioning and given every opportunity to become a loyal subject. More has been found guilty of treason and will be beheaded on July 6 at the Tower of London.
