News from the Fairfax County Health Department:

The Fairfax County Health Department (FCHD) will operate additional H1N1 vaccination clinics with expanded evening hours this week in the on-going effort to vaccinate the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) target groups, which include school-aged children. FCHD encourages you to bring your children to one of the weekly clinics if they have not yet received H1N1 vaccine. Vaccine is free of charge and available on a walk-in basis.

- Monday, Dec. 14, 1:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m.
- Tuesday, Dec. 15, 1:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m.
- Thursday, Dec. 17, 1:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m.

The H1N1 clinics will be open in the Health Department's 5 District Offices. Visit the FCHD Web site for the addresses and additional details:

The CDC recommends that children through 9 years of age receive 2 doses of H1N1 vaccine separated by 4 weeks (28 days or more). Parents may choose to receive a second dose through FCHD clinics or their health care provider.
