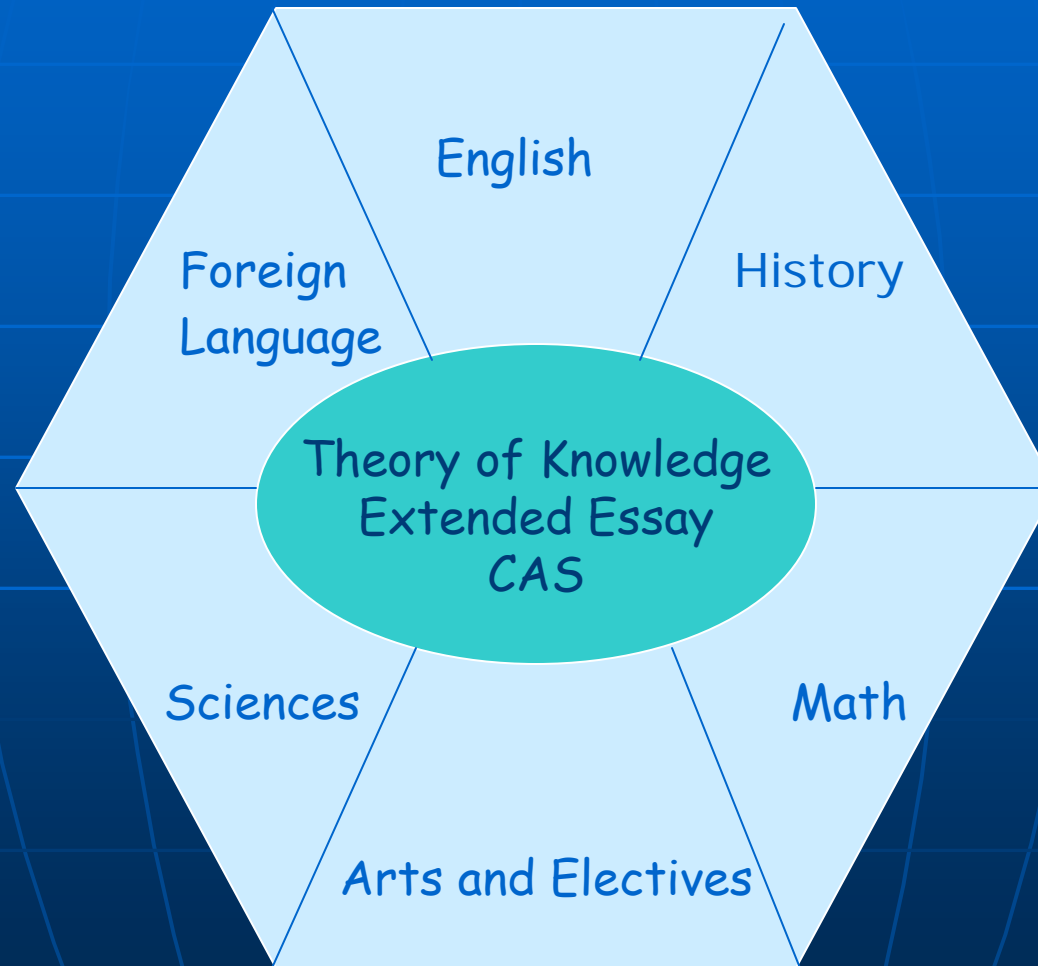

The Extended Essay

Deadlines for 2007-2008:

- Wednesday, November 7, 2007: 1 copy of rough draft due to IB office, 1 copy to mentor.
- Tuesday, January 29, 2008: 2 copies of final draft of paper to IB office.

CAS Hours

Deadlines for 2007-2008:

- Monday, March 31, 2008: All CAS forms (including signatures) and journals due to IB office.
- As a parent, you cannot sign off on the sheet as the activity supervisor.
- 50 hours Creativity, 50 hours Action, 50 hours Service.
- 10 total hours must be completed after January 1, 2008.

What Robinson students say...

IB Exams

Students matriculating in the College of Arts and Sciences will be considered for advanced standing credit for qualifying scores on higher level examinations. For details see http://artsandsciences.virginia.edu/college/classes/international_exams.html

General information about university admissions in

The College of Arts and Sciences offers possible credit for scores of 5, 6, or 7 on most higher-level IB examinations. We award no credit for standard-level examinations. Upon departmental recommendation, we will consider an award for one, and no more than two, semesters of College introductory-level credit. Scores below a 5 on the higher-level exam may be sufficient for higher-level placement (no credit will be awarded). Such advanced placement decisions must be made by the appropriate department.

Internship Information

- There must be an educational value, ideally connected to a college/career goal or selected to enhance personal growth.
- An observable/measurable product is required and must be verified by the site supervisor.
- The internship is an **OPTION** for IB diploma seniors upon completion of **ALL** IB internal assessments and IB exams.

Internship Application includes the following:

- Written proposal
- Extended Essay completed
- CAS journal, time sheet and reflective essay on its way to completion
- All internal assessments in all IB courses
- ToK paper and presentation
- Parent signature
- All teacher signatures
- A minimum of passing in all classes (including non-IB classes)
