

Service Learning at Robinson Secondary: Robinson Gives Back

Robinson Secondary is proud to recognize our students for service to the community. Students may wear a Service Learning Cord at graduation as a symbol of their dedication to making a difference in the community.

Students graduating in 2012 will qualify to wear the service cord with 30 hours of community service. Students graduating in 2013 and beyond will qualify to wear the service cord with 40 hours of community service.

Hours may be earned on one activity or over multiple activities and your service hour record is cumulative over your high school career. A formal application for the Service Learning Cord is not required. All qualifying hours must be submitted PRIOR to May 1 of the graduating year.

Additionally, students may choose to complete 50+ hours to qualify for the Virginia Board of Education Diploma Seal for Excellence in Civics Education. The Civic Seal requires a separate application and may be obtained from the student's social studies teacher or downloaded from the graduating class Blackboard 24/7 site.

Students are encouraged to set a goal of earning at least 10 service hours per year from the freshman year through graduation. Students may track their service hours through the Robinson Service Learning Tracker. The service tracker is only accessible through Blackboard 24/7. Students can find the tracker in their graduating class' Blackboard 24/7 site.
