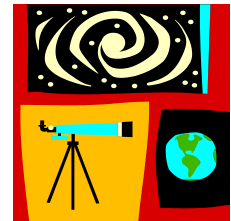

Astronomy Adventures this Week!

News from Ms. Bauer, Spring Hill Science Resource Teacher

Come join Spring Hill parent, Erik Swenson and the Analemma Society this Friday night from 6:00 – 8:00 PM at Turner Farm for our monthly star gazing adventure. Telescopes will be provided, but feel free to bring your own. Binoculars are also great tools for viewing stars. Remember, if you can't see the stars before heading out, the event will be cancelled. Information for Turner Farm: Address: 925 Springvale Road, Great Falls, VA 22066. Directions to the viewing area: From Route 7 heading west, turn right on Springvale Road, look for tall silo (former Nike missile site). Find a detailed park map at this website: <http://www.analemma.org/parkmap.html>



Helpful details: After you pass through the park entrance please turnoff your headlights and proceed with just parking lights on (if you feel you can do so safely) and proceed slowly to the parking area. Otherwise, your headlights will interfere with the night vision of those already there. Also, you should bring a flashlight, but please do not use it unless necessary. If you use your flashlight, it should remain pointed down. We hope to have a flashing red light near our telescope which may help people find us in the dark. If you aren't able to attend, here is some great information from Mr. Swenson to help you explore the night skies from your driveway!

First, if you have an ipad, ipod touch or an iphone, please consider downloading the free goskywatch planetarium application and then take it on outside on a clear night. This application will identify planets, stars and constellations as you raise your device to the heavens. Just make sure you put it in night mode to preserve your night vision.

Second, Jupiter is well placed in the east at 8 or 9 p.m. right now. It is almost at opposition, which put it overhead at midnight and as close to the earth as it gets. If you have a telescope, the Great Red Spot is periodically transiting the meridian at convenient hours. On Saturday, Nov. 12 it will at Jupiter's meridian at around 8:21 p.m. EST giving you your best shot at seeing it. Also, Io, Jupiter's innermost moon will transit the face of Jupiter as viewed from Earth starting at around 8:15 the same night. If your telescope has an objective of less than 8 inches, you may have trouble spotting little Io (about 2,300 miles in diameter) as it tends to blend in with Jupiter, but stay tuned because at 8:39 you'll be able to see its black shadow pass across the face of Jupiter. This is much easier to spot due to the contracts and even 4" telescope owners should have a good seat for the show. Just remember, unlike a lunar eclipse where the entire Moon is covered by the Earth's shadow, Io's shadow will only make a small black dot of a shadow appear on Jupiter's face. Even if you don't own a telescope, you should be able to see Jupiter's moons with a good pair of binoculars. (Tip: if you have a tripod, you should be able to attach the binoculars to them using the small socket on the bottom of the binoculars. You'll be able to see a lot more with the steadier view.)

Third, the Leonid Meteor shower is coming up on November 17.

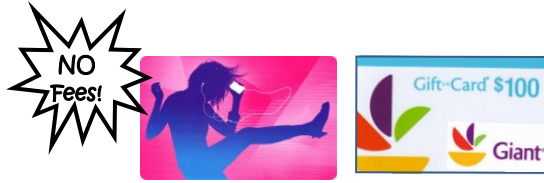
