

Dear Parents,

As most of you are aware, Spring Hill Elementary School is an official designated Eco School. For years, we have been attempting to assist our children in learning how we may work together to take care of our planet and its resources locally as well as globally. To that end, I would like to thank the wonderful efforts of two PTO parents Jen Trainor and Teri Bennet who co-chair our Outdoor Science Classroom. Their help has been exceptionally valuable in keeping science education in the forefront of one of our major school goals. In addition, the following website/Twitter feed was put together by Betsy Vrankovich and our own fantastic "Science Rock Star" Alison Bauer. You really owe it to yourself to click on the site below to learn about many of the Eco School activities your children are engaged in scientifically.

Our outdoor classrooms have increased the Green Hour time for all of our K - 2 students. Enjoy the photos and ask your children about the radishes. If only we'd had more sunshine this fall our harvest would have been even more substantial. But the radishes children planted and plucked were delicious!

Our October participation in the International Walk to School day has decreased our use of fossil fuels and created a new conversation about the need for safer walking/biking paths to Spring Hill ES, not to mention the benefit of keeping children fit by daily exercise. Check out the data and see how our habits are starting to change! We now have new bike racks ready to hold more bikes and scooters. The Green Club will plan our next Walk to School Day in December.

Currently, our Eco School project has been to increase our reduction of overall cafeteria waste. This is part of the Consumption and Waste pathway! The upper grade Green Club has made a training video and has shown it to all students and staff on the afternoon show. The 3rd grade designed an efficient method of disposal which has been tested with all grade levels. Currently, design changes are being discussed and tested. Potomac Disposal is collating data from the weight of our dumpsters. We'll report the data as soon as we receive it!

Our New Year activity regarding the Energy pathway will get our full attention come third quarter. We are asking our students to help figure out how our school building can become more energy efficient? Mrs. Lee's and Mr. Mosher's classes, and 6th grade science students from last year, collected baseline data which we will use to compare to this year's usage. We all wonder what their recommendations for change might be, so stay tuned!

I leave you with a photograph (below) taken during our faculty meeting yesterday that featured Dr. Mark Coles, a AAAS (American Association for the Advancement of Science) volunteer who is a scientist with the National Science Foundation, Mrs. Shelly Hynes, an Einstein Distinguished Scholar, Alison Bauer and yours truly. Dr. Coles will be advising us this year on inquiry student learning and Mrs. Hynes, who taught physics in Louisiana prior to her Distinguished Scholar appointment, spoke to us about experiential physics activities with elementary aged children.

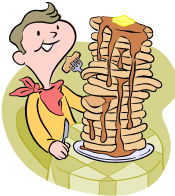

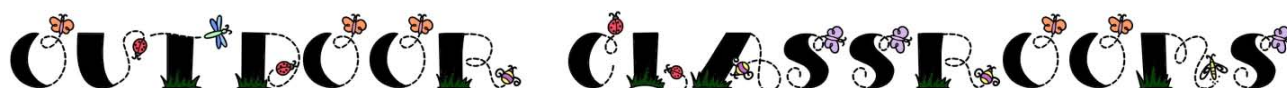

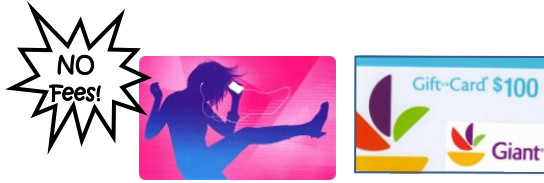
