BUS NOTES

A new and improved **Transportation Change**

Request Form (aka: "Bus Note" Form) is now available online at http://www.fcps.edu/SpringHillIES/files/parents_files/busform_2011.pdf as well as in the front office for \$3.00 per duplicate-copy pad.

This Form is to be used for every and all transportation changes to your child's normal mode of transportation home from school. Hand-written notes are not accepted. TWO copies of the form must be submitted each time the form is used (one copy remains in the front office - the other copy is given to your child).

Please remind your child to hand the form in to his or her teacher **first thing in the morning** when our PTO volunteers are here to administer the program. Volunteers cannot disturb instruction to go and get a note that was not turned in in the morning.

"Matching Notes" Program

Matching Notes are Bus Notes, matched-up by volunteers, turned in by children going home with another family. **Each** family involved must send in written permission using the "Bus Notes" Form. This program does not begin until Monday, October 3.

Please note that the Matching Notes program does not operate the day before Thanksgiving (November 23), the day before Winter Holiday (December 22,) nor the day before Spring Holiday (March 30). Please plan ahead if you must make alternate plans on these days. The program ends June 1.

REMINDER: There will be no matching notes accepted until October 3.
