

AP Course Enrollment Procedure for 2012-2013

All students who plan to enroll in an AP course for the 2012-2013 school year must adhere to the enrollment procedures listed below. If any student fails to follow the steps listed below, he or she will **NOT** be allowed to enroll in the AP course for next year.

- Attend an AP information session after school on **EITHER** Thursday, February 2nd or Monday, February 6th to learn about the requirements and expectations of the AP course or courses in which you want to enroll.
- Obtain an AP enrollment form from the first session you attend and get the proper signatures for each AP information session attended.
- Take the AP enrollment form home to your parents or guardians and get their signature on the form.
- Take the AP enrollment form with you when you meet with your counselor to select classes for next year.

Some students who are already in a sequential AP course in the same discipline may be excused from attending the AP information session and instead get a signature and course information from their current AP teacher. These students **STILL** must get a parent or guardian's signature on the AP enrollment form. The following classes qualify for this above exemption:

- AP Computer Science A
- AP French Language
- AP German Language
- AP Japanese Language and Culture
- AP Latin Vergil
- AP Spanish Literature

AP Information Session Dates and Times:

The AP Information Sessions will be offered on **Thursday, February 2nd** and **Monday, February 6th** immediately after school. Both afternoons will consist of three separate sessions, each session consisting of 20 minutes. During these sessions students will be given information concerning:

- The topics and information that will be covered in that particular AP course
- The amount of homework and preparation time to be expected
- The average amount of reading a student can expect per class
- An estimate of the number of exams, papers, projects and quizzes a student should expect per quarter
- If a summer assignment exists and, if so, what it will entail

Students will be given five minutes to move between sessions, but sessions will start promptly at the next listed time. Students may attend **any** AP Information Session during **any** of the three sessions on **either** day. **The only exception to this is AP World History, whose students MUST attend Session 1 on EITHER day.** Session times are as follows:

Session 1: 2:15 – 2:45 (the first 10 minutes will be used for a video presentation about AP classes)

Session 2: 2:50 – 3:10

Session 3: 3:15 – 3:35

The goal of these sessions is to help students to make better informed decisions about AP courses which they may consider taking. Please use these sessions to help you to determine whether or not a particular AP course will fit into your academic, athletic and social schedule. Also, keep in mind that **good attendance** is an important factor in the success of AP students.
