Greetings!

Please bring the following materials to school within the first two days of school. *Remember to label all your supplies with your name!*

You must have supplies each school day.

- 1 medium-sized three ring binder (2-3 inches)
 - Students will file papers by subject throughout each quarter. Binders with nylon zippered covers work well.
 - It will be critical to success in 6th grade to maintain organized materials.
- Loose leaf paper
- Graph paper
- 1 red pocket folder for music class
- 2 pocket folders (different colors) for Math and History SOL review materials
- Loose leaf dividers labeled:
 - 1.) **Math work**
 - 2.) **Math notes**
 - 3.) **Science**
 - 4.) **Health**
 - 5.) **Spelling/Vocabulary**
 - 6.) **Social Studies**
 - 7.) **Reading**
 - 8.) **Written Communication** (For papers we are working on in writing and grammar)
 - 9.) **Reference**
- 2 **composition books**
 - Written Communication Reference Notebook
 - Science / Health
- 1 Spiral Notebook for Social Studies Interactive book**

- 2 Blue or Black ballpoint pens (preferably erasable)
- #2 pencils with erasers (several)
- 1 highlighter

- 1 pair of scissors
- 1 pack of colored pencils or 1 box of crayons. (Markers may also be brought to school, but often cannot be used in interactive notebooks as the colors bleed through the paper.)
- glue sticks at least 10 (needed throughout the year for interactive notebook)
- 1 pencil bag that fits into your binder (no boxes)
- 1 **inexpensive** flash drive (thumb drive)
- 1 ruler – metric and customary units (preferably the ones that fit into the binder)
- 1 box of tissues
- 1 container of Clorox Wipes (last names A –M)
- 1 bottle of hand sanitizer (last names N –Z)

Not needed at school – may be useful for some homework assignments.

- 1 protractor
- 1 compass
- 1 scientific calculator – (square root & exponent functions)

Please do not bring spiral notebooks (other than 1 for SS) or tape to school.

*Storage space is limited to student desks and binders. Extra materials should not be brought to school.

All toys are to be left at home.
