Parents and guardians may request general information about Fairfax County Public Schools, receive help in communicating with a child's school, or ask a question.

A school system employee will respond to callers in their preferred language within 24 hours; Monday through Friday. Responders will provide parents with the requested information, assist them in speaking with the appropriate school employee, and/or refer them to the appropriate resources.

Parent Liaisons:

A Link Between Home and School Cultures



Parent liaisons are school staff members who work with both parents and staff. They help parents get the information and assistance they need to support their child at home and ensure their child’s success in school. Parent liaisons serve as a communication link between home and school. They welcome and orient families to the school and familiarize them with the Fairfax County Public Schools’ procedures and practices.

Parent liaisons know a great deal about both schools and community. They are a valuable resource for parents. They can connect parents with the appropriate people within the school or community who can help meet the family’s needs.

You may contact the parent liaison through the main office at your child’s school.

Bilingual community liaisons support student registrars in providing all families with information about school and community services to ensure a smooth transition to the Fairfax County Public School (FCPS) community. Community liaisons work collaboratively within FCPS and the Fairfax County Human Services departments to provide all information in one place, including the following:

- Free School Physicals, Immunizations and TB Screenings
- Medical Insurance | Child Care Programs | School Curriculum
- Parent Resource Center | Family Resource Centers | Recreation, Leisure and Libraries | Free and Reduced Cost Meal Program | Food Stamps/SNAP
- Transportation Schedules | Adult English Classes | Parent Liaisons
- Job Training and Employment
