

How can students visit with the counselor?

- A student can ask to visit.
- A teacher can send a student for a visit.
- A counselor can invite a student to visit.



- A parent can ask the counselor to visit with a student.
- An administrator can ask the counselor to visit with a student.

Parents are notified regarding on-going individual or group visits with students.

School counselors reach out to all students.

Sometimes 'life' gets in the way of learning. *A friend is not so friendly on the playground. A child can be worried about a family member. A bus interaction may leave a child upset.*

When students have strong feelings that prevent him or her from doing his or her best in class, counselors are available to problem solve, facilitate communication and sometimes **just listen**. The counseling program supports and complements the efforts of the classroom teacher to facilitate your child's learning.

- Share information with parents related to child development.
