Kessler: Ms. Reconnu, Ms. Boyce, Ms. Gorham and Ms. Posey and grades 3, 4 and 6

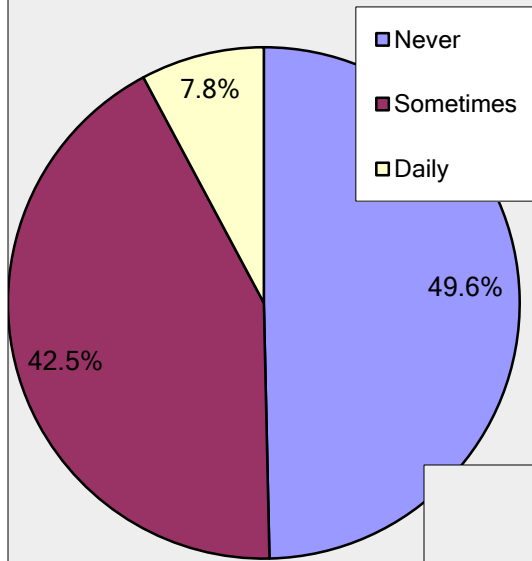
TARGET GOALS AND BENCHMARKS

School wide program goal: Decrease student perception of prevalence of bullying in students in grades 1-6 by 10% by April 2012

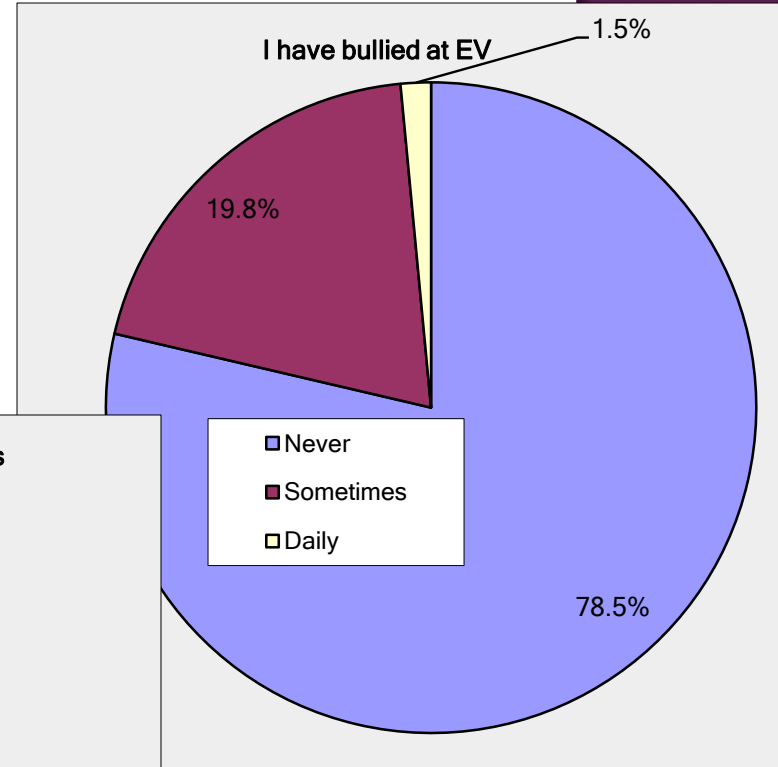

PERSONAL EXPERIENCES WITH BULLYING

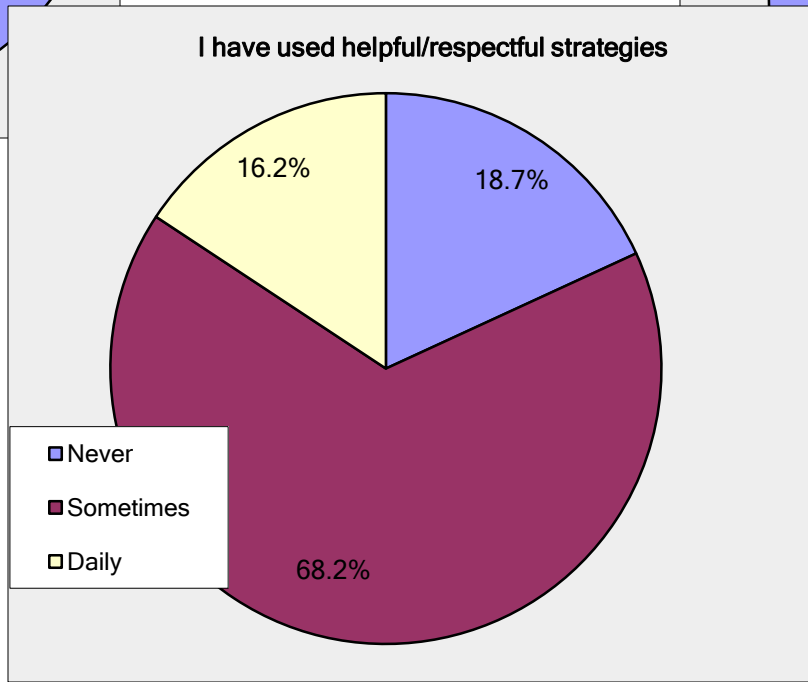
I have been bullied at EV

TARGET GOALS AND BENCHMARKS

Closing the Achievement Gap goal:

- ⦿ Increase reading and math SOL pass rate of 4-6th grade students in selected subgroups achieving below the 90% performance band by 10%.

Differentiated instruction for all students' is embedded in the "EV Way"

- ⦿ Daily and/or bi-monthly study skills assistance is provided to support students

ASCA/FCPS TIME DISTRIBUTION GUIDELINES

- ◉ **50-60%** -Individual and small group counseling, consultation with parents and crisis intervention
- ◉ **20-30%**- Classroom guidance lessons
- ◉ **15%**-Collaborative program and school support activities and professional development
- ◉ **5%**-Individual student planning

DIRECT SERVICES

- Small group counseling- Topics offered this year will be: Emotion Management, Decision Making/Problem Solving, Changing Families, Self Control, Anger Management, Study Skills
- Individual counseling
- Consultation with parents
- Crisis intervention

CLASSROOM GUIDANCE LESSONS

- ◉ Monthly lessons which support each year's focus. For 2011-12, these lessons support bullying prevention initiative
- ◉ Also develop and teach lessons based on special requests from teachers

2011-12 GUIDANCE LESSON TOPICS

- ◉ September: Introduction to the counselors and what is a class meeting?
- ◉ October: The continuum of respect and extinguishing the flame of bullying
- ◉ November: Responding to Stop-Walk-Talk and STOP: “Eagles Show Respect”
- ◉ December: Walk/Talk-Be Assertive Is it telling or tattling?
- ◉ January: Honoring and Respecting Diversity
- ◉ February: Primary-I Message practice
- ◉ Upper-Quelling Gossip and Rumors
- ◉ March: Primary-Respect on the playground
- ◉ Upper-Cyber bullying
- ◉ April: Looking in the directions of careers
- ◉ May/June: The next learning stage
