

Programs or Other Services

Program	Description
Academy Shuttles	For first session classes, students go to their attending schools and are shuttled from there to academy sites, if the academy is close enough to be manageable for transportation. Second and third session students are between academy and attending school.
Administratively Placed Students Transportation	Administratively placed students are assigned to schools other than their own, typically as a result of behavioral issues. Students are transported by school bus, if possible.
AIM Programs	Summit students are assigned to the program as a result of behavioral issues. Students are transported by taxi.
Alternative Learning Centers	ALC students are assigned to the program as a result of behavioral issues. Students are transported by school bus, if possible.

Choice School	Option schools for students affected by NCLB designations
Community based instruction (CBI)	Students who go to businesses within 5 miles of base school to work or learn in the community -
Elementary Magnet Schools Baileys & Hunters Woods	Have programs developed to attract students from outside normal boundaries. Extremely limited transportation is provided.
Emotionally disturbed (ED)	
ESL	Out-of-base runs for second language learners; most are now in their base schools
Exception to Ride	Buses often have seats available after afor eligible riders are "assigned". These seats are available because there is insufficient time to fill them. Ineligible student parents can apply for an exception for their children to ride a bus. Approval is based on seat availability and non-hazardous access to the bus stop.
FECEP/Headstart Runs	Runs for FECEP students separate from regular ES run times (Family Early Childhood Education Program is FCPS' funded version of Head Start; most of these preschool aged children ride with regular students either going in or going home; some do not)
Field Trips	Field trips within and outside Fairfax County are taken during the midday, after school, and on weekends when buses are available.
Hearing impaired (HI)	
Kindergarten Runs	Midday runs to take PM KG to school and AM KG home
Late Runs	Runs after the school to home runs - these begin when drivers finish take home runs and get back to the schools
Late Runs - ES	Usually after HS and MS late runs
Late Runs - HS	Usually 3 - 4 hours after last ES run - reduced number of buses with more centralized stops when possible
Late Runs - MS	Usually 3 - 4 hours after last ES run - reduced number of buses with more centralized stops when possible

Moderately retarded (MMR)

Modified Calendar Schools - ES	Annandale Terrace, Dogwood, Franconia, Glen Forest, Graham Road, Parklawn, Timber Lane ESs - schools are on special schedules with sessions beginning and ending outside the regular cycle.
Modified Calendar Schools - HS	Stuart - has early June end date; early August start date
Modified Calendar Schools - MS	Glasgow & Poe - early June end date; early Aug start
Non-categorical (NC)	Typically autistic students prior to their final placement
PAC	Preschool students who have extended days and attend classes all year
Physically Disabled (PD)	
Preschool (PS)	2 - 4 ? Year olds: classes all begin at 9 a.m. or later; some are half day, some all day, some every day, some on selected days, wildly varying schedules.
Project Opportunity	This program is for pregnant students or new mothers. Students attend either Mountain View or Bryant and are transported by school bus, if possible.
Pupil Placements	Pupil placed students are not eligible for transportation unless it is to and from a day care placement within the placement school's boundary.

Summit Programs	Summit students are assigned to the program as a result of behavioral issues. Students are transported by school bus, if possible
TJ Late Buses	Runs begin at 5:30; students are taken to central locations like libraries and schools and dropped off
TJHSST	Magnet students who now ride to their base schools and are shuttled to TJ to start by 8:30; in PM runs begin in late afternoon and take students to neighborhood stops, often with pickup bus meeting other buses at a distant central location, transferring some of the students, to shorten the students' total time on the bus
