Communications Corner: Effective Bulletins

The beginning of a new school year marks a new season for letters, bulletins, newsletters, and other communications between school and home. Keeping news and ideas fresh is an important part of making sure that school and classroom publications and bulletins get noticed and read. Here's a quick checklist of items to consider when preparing some typical school publications:

Welcome Letters

Welcome letters are generally sent home by teachers at the beginning of the school year or when a new student enrolls. Some items for these letters might include:

- A roster of basic subjects and overall goals and plans for the year.
- A phone number and time when the teacher can be reached. Include an e-mail address if appropriate.
- A personal request to parents to share concerns and ask questions.

Calendars

Monthly or annual calendars highlight upcoming school events and meetings. Here are some tips for calendar preparation:

- Use a design that accommodates easy posting on the refrigerator door.
- Include ideas for each day, week, or month on ways families can help children learn. For example, "Ask your child to identify the items in your home that are square, circular, and triangular." Also, "Make a list of ways we could save energy throughout the year."
- Consider including upcoming community events, holidays, anniversaries or other celebrations that might make good learning experiences for families.

Benefits

Long-Term Disability Insurance Rates Reduced

As you prepare for the new school year, the Office of Benefits Services has good news. The cost for long-term disability (LTD) insurance will be cheaper this school year. Most FCPS employees have long-term disability insurance, which provides income replacement should you become disabled for longer than six months. Periodically, the contract for the LTD benefit is bid out, and this summer the contract with Liberty Mutual was renewed. As a result, **employee premium deductions have been reduced by two cents per one hundred dollars of covered income** (from \$.25/\$100 of your salary to \$.23/\$100 of your salary). Although the cost of this insurance is cheaper, the benefit coverage remains the same, i.e., two-thirds of your salary is replaced if your medical situation warrants. While we hope you never need to use this benefit, it is good to know this salary protection is there. For more LTD plan information visit www.fcps.edu/DHR/employees/benefits.

Discounts on Microsoft Software Available to FCPS Staff Members and Students

Fairfax County Public Schools is partnering with Microsoft to offer its students and staff members discounted Microsoft software. The Microsoft Student Select program offers Microsoft Office © and Microsoft Windows XP © Upgrade software applications at special education discounts. Students and staff members purchase software directly online through Journey Education Marketing, a leading provider of educational software distribution services. A student or staff member simply visits the Journey Education Marketing e-commerce web site, enters his or her student or employee identification number (for verification of student or employment status), and then may purchase one copy of each software title available through the program.

Product discounts available through this program equate to savings of over 70 percent when compared to the same titles that are commercially available. For example, Microsoft Office Professional has a manufacturer's suggested retail price of \$499. Under the Student Select program, the same product is available for \$59.98.

This program will enable students and staff members to use, at home, the same latest Microsoft software packages that they use in FCPS.

The Technology@Home program enables FCPS to work with its technology vendors and partners such as Dell and Hewlett-Packard to provide discounted technology products for home use. These programs will provide students, parents, and staff

members the ability to take full advantage of the latest available technology and to access student and employee resources and information available online through FCPS.

FCPS Directives Now Only Available Electronically

Effective July 1, the Code of Virginia no longer requires school libraries to maintain hard copies of notices, policies, and regulations (also known as directives). Therefore, hard copies of directives will no longer be distributed, and schools and administrative work sites are no longer required to maintain copies of the policy manual.

Any citizen who requests a hard copy of a directive has a right to receive it and should be provided the most current version printed from the web page. The School Board office, at Gatehouse Administration Center I, will continue to maintain the historical records of all directives.

Tips for Your Health: It's Not Too Early to Plan for a Flu Clinic for Your Site

Believe it or not, it is not too early to be thinking about flu shots. According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the flu is responsible for more than 114,000 hospitalizations and approximately 36,000 deaths annually in the U.S. It is estimated that between 10 percent and 20 percent of the population will get the flu in a given year. The CDC recommends the most effective strategy for avoiding the flu is to get an annual immunization. HR Wellness will offer flu shots again this year beginning in October. The flu clinics are open to all FCPS employees, retirees, and family members. Attendees must be 18 years or older. Any FCPS site, with a required minimum of 25 interested participants, can hold a flu clinic. Smaller sites that cannot meet the 25 minimum requirements can partner with other nearby sites to share a clinic.

The flu immunizations will be provided by Norvar Health Services at a cost of \$22 payable by either cash or check. If you would like to organize a flu clinic at your site, contact your site wellness liaison. If you do not have an assigned wellness liaison at your site but would like to hold a flu clinic, contact HRWellness@fcps.edu.

Flu clinics will also be held during the fall open enrollment open houses on a walk-in basis for FCPS employees and retirees as well as their family members 18 years and older. Look for more details regarding the dates, times, and locations of the open enrollment flu clinics in the upcoming Benefits Briefings.

Overseas teacher exchange opportunities are available for the 2008-09 school year. FCPS participates in the school-year direct exchanges. Other short-term exchanges are not supported by the school system due to the impact on instructional programs. In addition to meeting the Fulbright eligibility requirements, **applicants must have taught for three years in FCPS prior to the exchange year**. Opportunities and other eligibility requirements vary by country.
