1. **CLOSED MEETING**

Chairman Phillip Niedzielski-Eichner called for a motion at 6 p.m. for the Board to convene a closed meeting with the following Board members present:

Mr. Gibson moved, and Mrs. Strauss seconded, that the Board go into closed session: 1) to discuss and consider disciplinary matters concerning students pursuant to Virginia Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(2); and to discuss and consider the acquisition and disposition of publicly held real property, where discussion in an open meeting would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of the public body pursuant to Virginia Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(3). The motion **passed unanimously.**

2. **MEETING OPENING**

2.01 **Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance/Moment of Silence/National Anthem – Stuart High School Madrigals**

Chairman Niedzielski-Eichner convened the Board in public session at 7:12 p.m. with all Board members present. Also present were Division Superintendent Jack D. Dale; Deputy Superintendent Brad Draeger; Executive Assistant and Clerk of the Board Pamela Goddard; Deputy Clerk Linda Sabo; and certain other members of staff. Student Representative to the School Board Samantha Kunkel was present.

Chairman Niedzielski-Eichner thanked the Stuart High School Madrigals, under the direction of Margaret Woods, for their performance of the National Anthem.

2.02 **Annual School Board Organization** - Elect chairman and vice chairman; designate meeting dates; approve School Board salaries and mileage reimbursements; appoint the clerk, deputy clerks, agents, and deputy agents (SB; Exhibit A)

Chairman Niedzielski-Eichner said that Section 22.1-76 of the Code of Virginia specified that, at the annual organizational meeting, a school board shall elect one of its members as chairman and one as vice chairman, and shall approve

other appointments and designations of responsibility necessary for Board operations during the year; and he turned the gavel over to Dr. Dale for the purpose of presiding over the election of the chairman.

Dr. Dale opened the floor to nominations for Chairman of the School Board.

Mrs. Oleszek moved, and Mr. Storck seconded, that Ilryong Moon be nominated as Chairman of the School Board of Fairfax County, Virginia.

Discussion included the following: that Mr. Moon's life embodied the American dream; that he had served as an appointed member of the School Board, and was subsequently elected to the School Board in 1995, earning the distinction of having been the first Asian-American to be elected to public office in Virginia; that he had dedicated many years of public service to the community at large; that she believed that Mr. Moon's inclusive leadership style would foster unity and encourage creative policies that would strengthen the school system (Oleszek); that Mr. Moon was deeply committed to the school system and the community as a whole (Storck); that she appreciated Mr. Moon's willingness to listen to different viewpoints (Belter); that Mr. Moon was well-qualified for the position, and understood the importance of working collaboratively with his colleagues (Niedzielski-Eichner).

Hearing no other nominations, the motion that Ilryong Moon be elected Chairman of the School Board of Fairfax County, Virginia **passed unanimously.**

Dr. Dale turned the gavel over to Mr. Moon, who thanked his colleagues for their support. Mr. Moon said that he was not accepting the chairmanship to advance any particular agenda; that he considered the role of chairman to be one of facilitating discussion and debate among Board and staff members, and engaging in healthy dialogues with members of the community; that Board members were dedicated to providing the best learning environment for students; and he expressed his appreciation to his predecessor, Mr. Niedzielski-Eichner, for his diligent service over the past year, and to his parents for providing him all the educational opportunities he needed to attain success. Mr. Moon recognized various individuals in the audience: former School Board member Ernestine Heastie, Superintendent of the Arlington District of the United Methodist Church in Virginia Dr. Young Jin Cho, and Senior Pastor Reverend Dr. Young Bong; his wife, Haewon, whom he thanked for supporting him throughout his public service career, and his eldest son Joonyoung. Mr. Moon said that his son Woonyoung was unable to attend the meeting. Mr. Moon then opened the floor for nominations for vice chairman.

Mrs. Wilson moved, and Mrs. Smith seconded, that Brad Center be nominated for the position of Vice Chairman of the School Board of Fairfax County, Virginia.

Discussion included the following: that she appreciated the level of preparedness Mr. Center brought to the Board; that he was always willing to consider all sides of the issues before the Board, and displayed passion for those things that he felt were most important (Wilson); that Mr. Center was a great collaborator, and that he would be a great leader for the school division (Smith); that Mr. Moon and Mr. Center would make a strong team that would serve the Board well in its efforts to provide the best possible education for Fairfax County students (Strauss); that he appreciated Mr. Center's ability to disagree on issues without becoming personally offended (Gibson); and that she had appreciated Mr. Center's support (Kunkel).

The motion that Brad Center be elected Vice Chairman of the School Board of Fairfax County, Virginia **passed unanimously.**

Mr. Center said that it was a privilege to serve on the Board; that the Board would surmount the challenges it faced provided it continued working as a team; and he thanked his colleagues for their support.

Mr. Niedzielski-Eichner said that he had been honored to serve as Chairman of the Board; he thanked his colleagues for their support over the past year; he had appreciated the opportunity to work closely with the Leadership Team; that the school division would face challenges in its effort to sustain excellence; and he had great confidence in the dedication and abilities of the Board and the staff members.

Mr. Niedzielski-Eichner moved, and Mrs. Strauss seconded, that the School Board authorize organizational arrangements and appointments as follows:

1. Designate the following as regular business meeting dates: January 12 and 26, February 9 and 23, March 9 and 23, April 6 and 27, May 11 and 25, June 8 and 22, July 13 and 27, September 7 and 21, October 5 and 19, November 2 and 14, December 7 and 21, 2006; and January 11 and 25, 2007. Regular business meetings are typically held on Thursdays. Special meetings, Board committee work sessions, and other special functions will also be scheduled. Committees of three Board members hear student disciplinary cases in closed meetings, typically on Tuesdays. The Board does not meet in August. The Board's calendar of meeting dates will be based on the school year and will be initially set and published in August.
2. Set the salary of Board members at \$12,000 per year and that of the Board Chairman at \$13,000, and reimbursement for local mileage at the Federal mileage reimbursement rate for official School Board business travel.

3. Compensate the student representative for attendance at public meetings not to exceed \$50 per day and reimburse for local mileage at the Federal mileage reimbursement rate for official School Board business travel.
4. Approve Brad Draeger, Deputy Superintendent, to serve as the Superintendent's designee to attend any meeting of the School Board that the Superintendent cannot attend.
5. Appoint Pamela Goddard as Executive Assistant and Clerk of the School Board.
6. Appoint Pat Charbonneau and Linda Sabo as Deputy Clerks of the School Board.
7. Appoint John Quast and Brian Waymire as Deputy Clerks of the School Board for the limited purpose of signing titles to School Board vehicles; and appoint Bok Nam Degregorio, Arnold Dunbar, Margaret A. Misantone, Sherri Stern, Mary J. Thomas, and Roger A. Pearson as Deputy Clerks of the School Board for the limited purpose of countersigning payment warrants.
8. Appoint Robert John, Anita Kapper, Bob Lausier, Doris Manyfield, and Mahmood Sheikh as Agents of the School Board to examine, approve, and order payment of financial obligations of the Board; and appoint Natalie Nankovitch-Anderson, Kristen Fang, Kathleen Finnerty, Mary Keninitz, Dalila Khalafi, John Lako, Michael Lunter, Kevin McCarty, Joy Russom, and Helen Shiflett as Deputy Agents of the School Board to perform those functions in the absence of the Agents.
9. Appoint Constance A. Downing as Agent of the School Board to approve disbursements made from all petty cash funds.
10. Authorize the Chairman and Clerk to sign all legal documents for the Board, other than those requiring the signature of some other officer; and authorize the Vice Chairman to sign in the absence of the Chairman, and the Deputy Clerks in the absence of the Clerk.
11. Authorize Brad Draeger, Deputy Superintendent, and Deirdra McLaughlin, Chief Financial Officer, to execute official documents relating to state, federal, and impact aid requiring the Superintendent's signature.
12. Retain Thomas J. Cawley, Esquire, and the firm of Hunton & Williams to provide general legal services to the School Board and the school division.
13. Retain John Cafferky, Esquire, and the firm of Blankingship & Keith to provide special education legal services to the school division. Retain John F. Ring, Esquire, and the firm of Morgan Lewis & Bockius to provide employment and benefits law service.
14. Organize Board standing committees on Facilities and Operations; Instruction, Special Services, and Youth Development; Legislation, Policy, and Future Issues; and Resource Management and Development; and the Audit Ad Hoc Committee.

4. **PRESENTATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S FY 2007 PROPOSED BUDGET**

TAPE REFERENCE: 1-2965

4.01 **Presentation of Superintendent's FY 2007 Proposed Budget** (Exhibit E)

Dr. Dale presented the FCPS FY 2007 proposed budget. The budget, totaling \$2.1 billion, represented a \$184.2 million or 9.5 percent increase over the FY 2006 approved budget; the budget was developed using a tiered approach and included \$102.3 million to cover basic and mandatory rate and price increases; \$46.5 million for a three percent market scale adjustment; \$15.4 million for *No Child Left Behind* requirements, instructional programs, technology, and facilities preventative maintenance; and \$20 million for the Supporting and Rewarding Excellence Initiative; that this budget focused on instruction and devoted resources to help students meet federal and state testing requirements, expanded full-day kindergarten to seven additional elementary schools, and provided additional teachers for elementary and middle schools.

Mr. Moon called for a short recess.

Gary Chevalier, Director of Facilities Planning Services, presented the staff recommendations related to the attendance area for the new elementary school at the west Fairfax site, and a boundary adjustment related to West Springfield High School.

Discussion included the following: the request that the involvement with Greenbriar West be clarified (Niedzielski-Eichner); the response that moving students from Melville Lane and Madonna Lane from Greenbriar West to Greenbriar East was not recommended as it had been in previous studies (Chevalier); the question why the attendance area of West Springfield High School was being expanded (Belter); the response that the proposal impacted a very small number of students from the Daventry community who would

otherwise be split from the students with whom they had been attending elementary and middle school (Chevalier); that she would have expected that students from Rolling Valley Elementary School would have been included in the West Springfield High School boundary proposal (Belter); the response that students who attended Rolling Valley Elementary School split after elementary school (Chevalier); the question how many students from the Daventry community would be sent to West Springfield High School under the proposal (Oleszek); the response that the total would be approximately 80 students phased in over the next four years (Chevalier); the question how many students would be added by Rolling Valley Elementary School if they moved (Oleszek); the response that approximately 80 students (over the next four years) would attend West Springfield who attended Rolling Valley Elementary (Chevalier); the question whether it was Board policy to eliminate all split feeders (Oleszek); a negative response (Chevalier); the question whether Daventry community students were the only ones who split after middle school (Center); an affirmative response (Chevalier); the question whether pupil placement policies would enable students from Daventry to attend Lee High School (Center); an affirmative response (Chevalier); the question whether students currently attending Lee High School would be impacted by the recommendations (Center); a negative response (Chevalier); the question whether staff members had considered recommending that students from Daventry be moved back into the Key Middle School attendance area (Storck); a negative response; that Key Middle School was scheduled to begin renovation soon (Chevalier); and that public hearings were scheduled for January 30 and 31, a work session was scheduled for February 13, and action was scheduled for February 23 (Moon).
