Details of the Study:

The Fairfax County Public Schools Family Engagement Survey asked parents/guardians for feedback on their involvement and engagement at their child’s school.

K12 *Insight* partnered with division staff members to develop the survey, which addressed the following topics:

- Welcoming Environment
- Communication
- Student Success
- Advocacy
- Family and School Partnerships
- Collaboration With the Community

This survey was open from March 13 to April 10.

Email invitations with unique survey links were sent to parents/guardians. Parents/Guardians also could participate via a public link on the division’s website. Reminders were sent March 17, 23, and 29 and April 4 and 8. Paper surveys were available on request. Parents/Guardians with children attending more than one division school could take the survey for each school.

The survey and email invitations were translated into Amharic, Arabic, Chinese, Farsi, Korean, Pashto, Spanish, Urdu, and Vietnamese.

Results are compared with those from 2018-2019. Results do not reflect random sampling; therefore, they should not be generalized to all parents/guardians of students in Fairfax County Public Schools. Rather, results reflect only the perceptions and opinions of survey participants.

The findings for each item exclude participants who did not answer. In charts and graphs, data labels less than 5 percent are not shown. Percentages may not total 100 due to rounding.

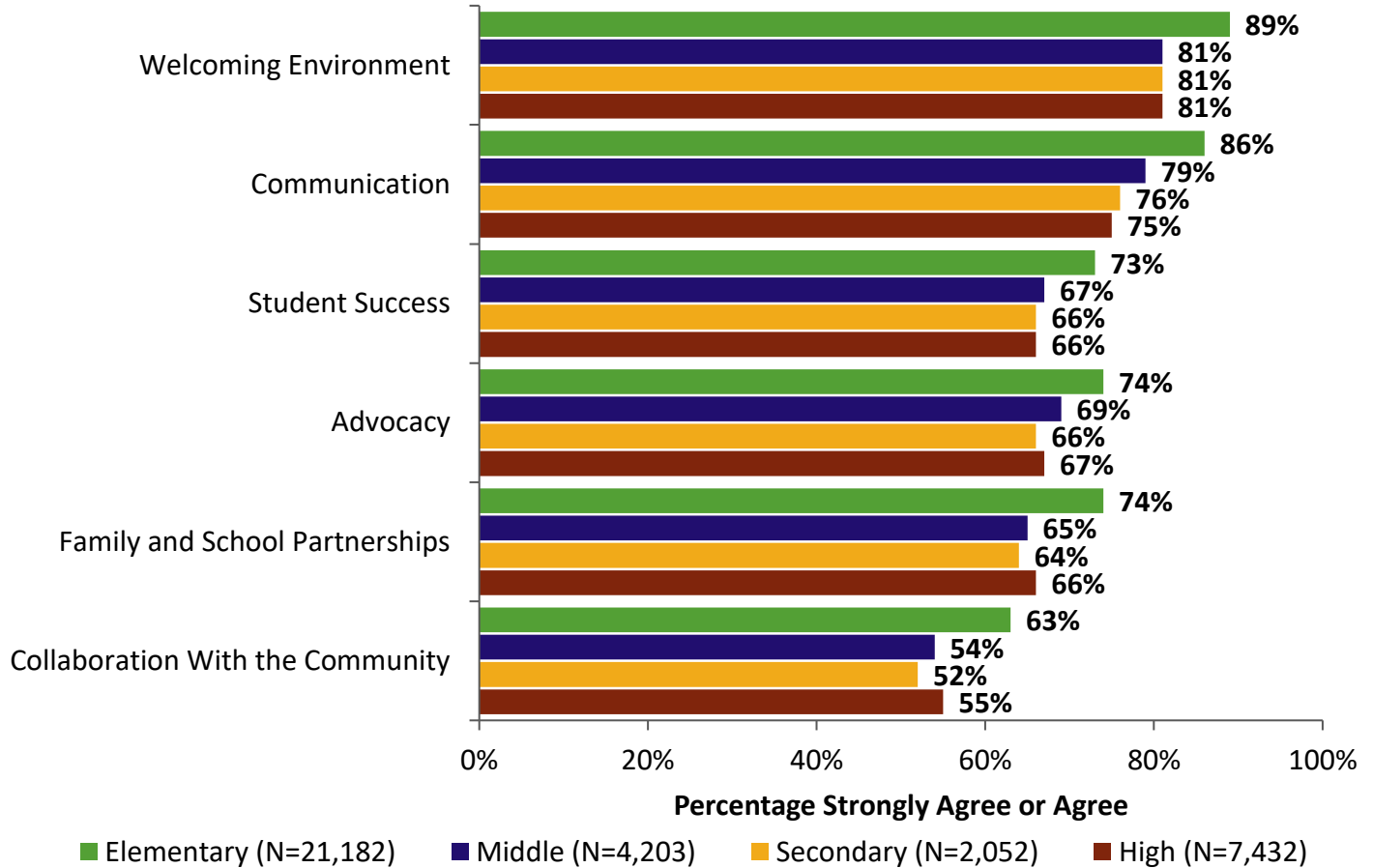

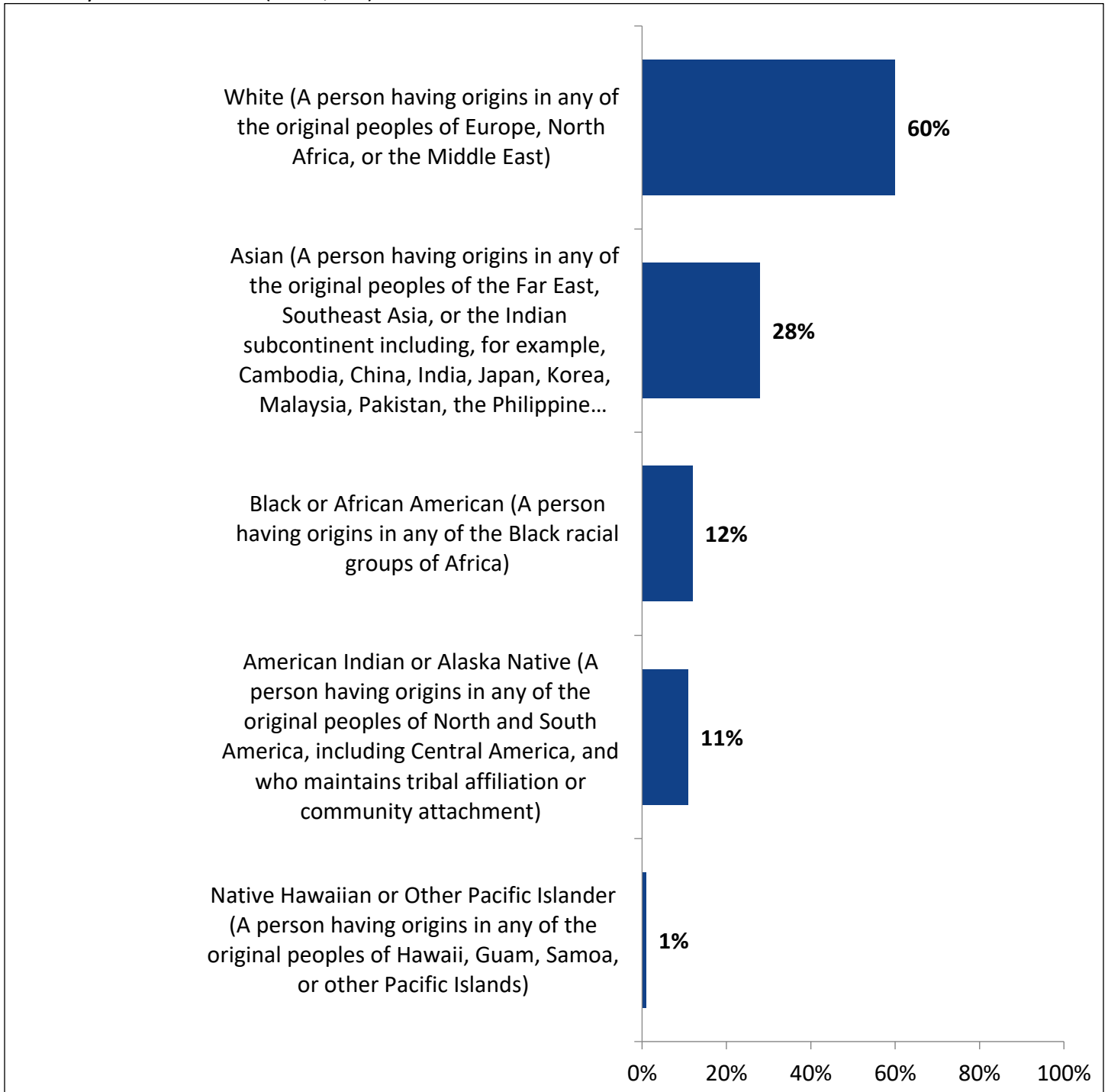
Key Insights:

- 84% of participating parents/guardians indicated they were respected or very respected at their child’s school and 83% indicated their child was respected or very respected at their school.
- The Welcoming Environment dimension had the highest percentage of Agree and Strongly Agree responses (86%). However, there was a modest difference between school levels, with participating elementary school parents/guardians at 89% compared with 81% for parents/guardians at all other school levels.
- Generally, participating elementary school parents/guardians responded the most favorably (Strongly Agree or Agree) to items throughout the survey. *My child feels safe at school* was the highest-ranking item for elementary parents/guardians, with 95% agreeing or strongly agreeing with that statement. The highest-ranking item for all other school levels was *This school welcomes families of different backgrounds and cultures*, with 88% of participating middle school and 86% of secondary and high school parents/guardians agreeing or strongly agreeing with that statement.
- Within the Communication dimension, 90% of participating parents/guardians said information provided by their child’s school is easy to understand and 84% said school staff keeps them informed of their child’s progress.
- Within the Advocacy dimension, 86% of participating parents/guardians said their child’s school recognizes and respects families’ cultural, ethnic, and religious diversity. Other items in this dimension had high percentages of Don’t Know responses, ranging from 7% to 40%.

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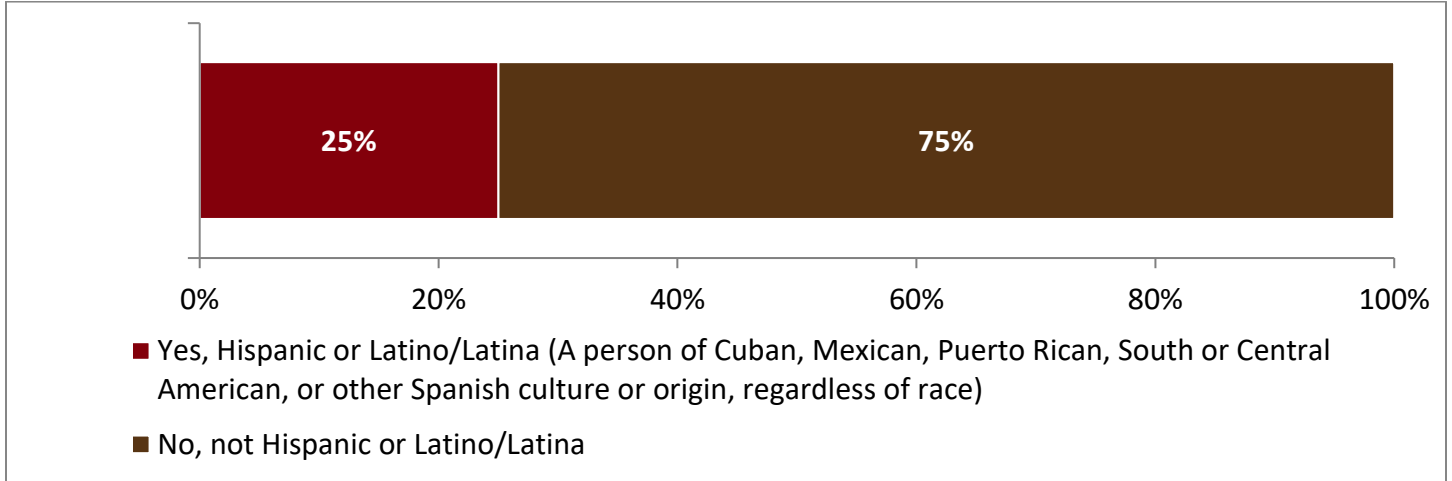

What is your child's race? (N=29,310)

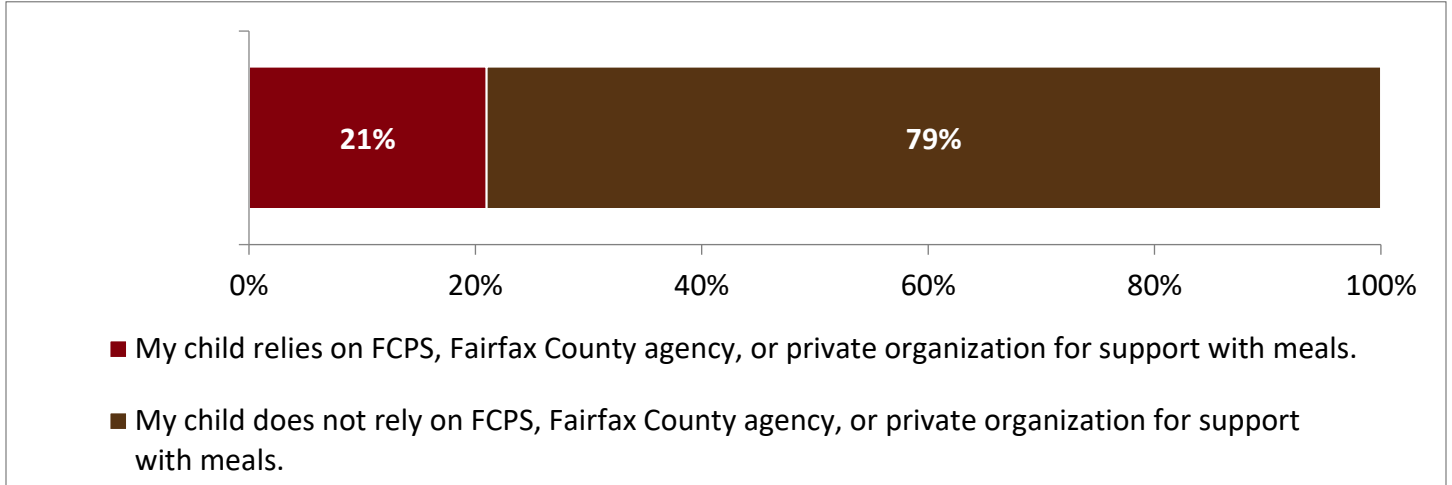


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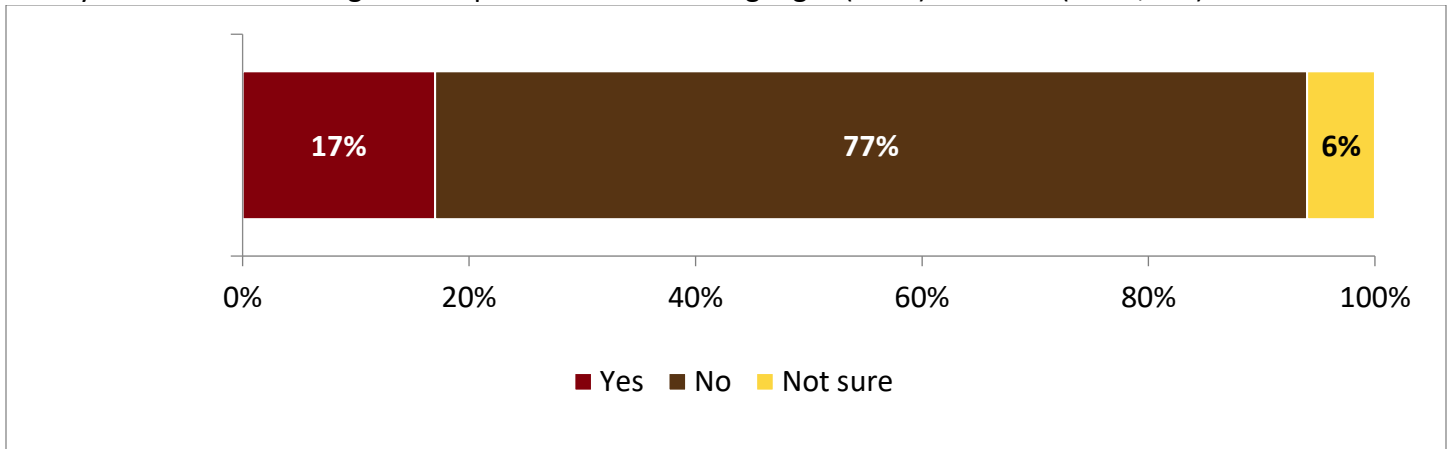
Is your child Hispanic or Latino/Latina? (N=32,577)



What best describes your child's food situation? (N=32,688)

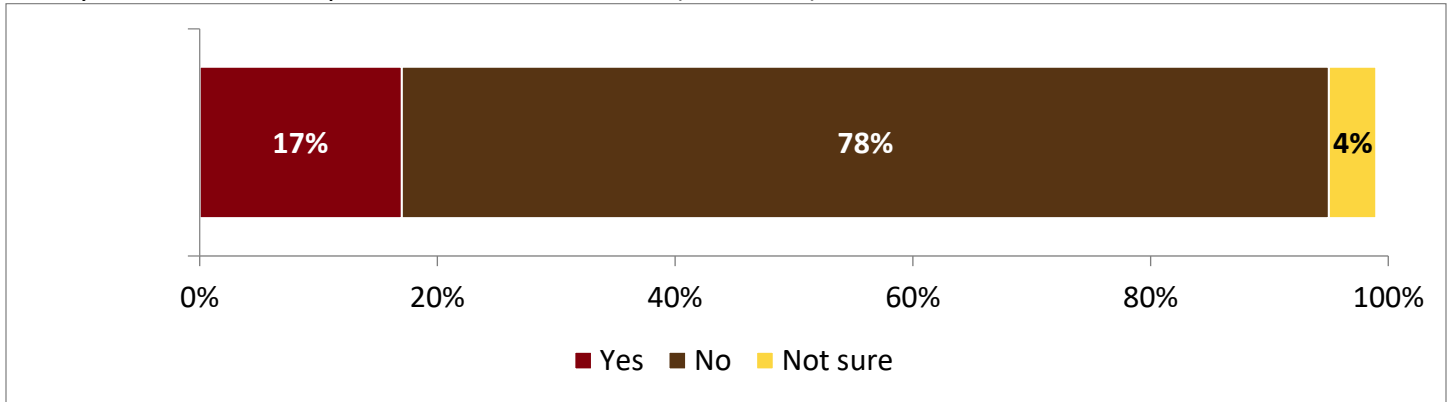


Does your child receive English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) services? (N=33,976)

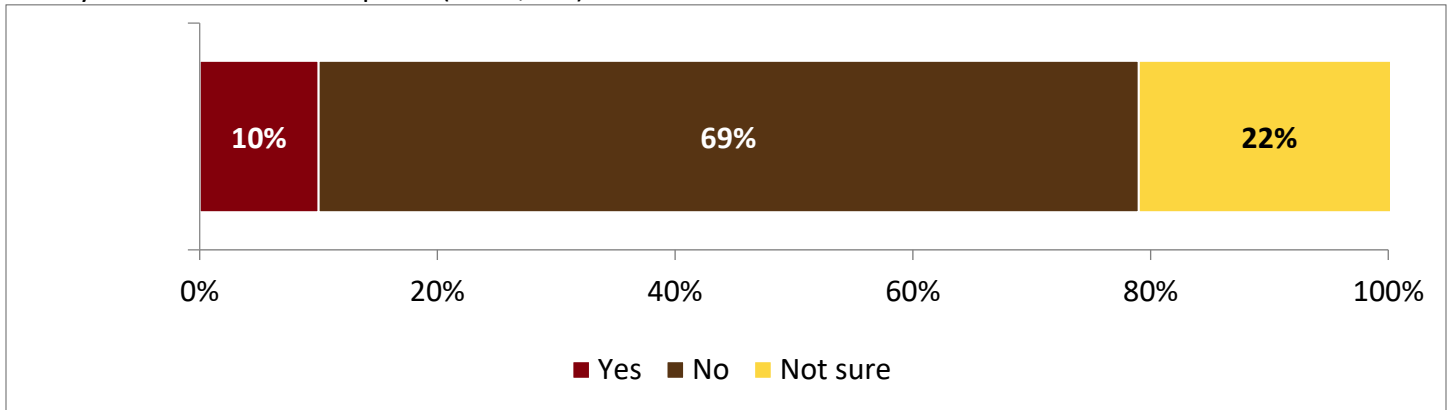


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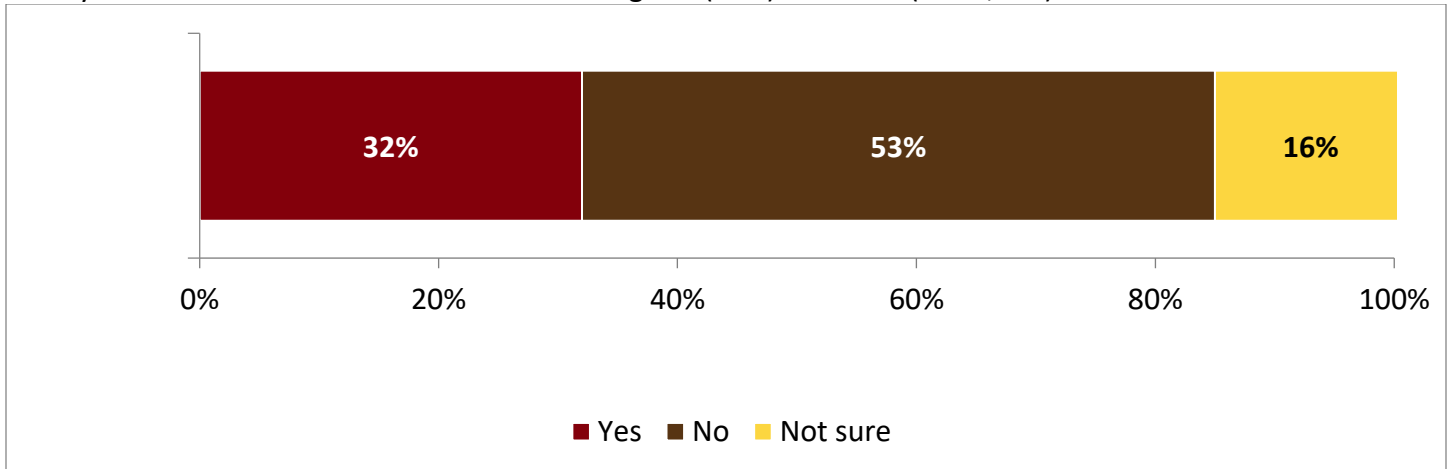
Does your child receive special education services? (N=34,017)



Does your child have a 504 plan? (N=33,743)

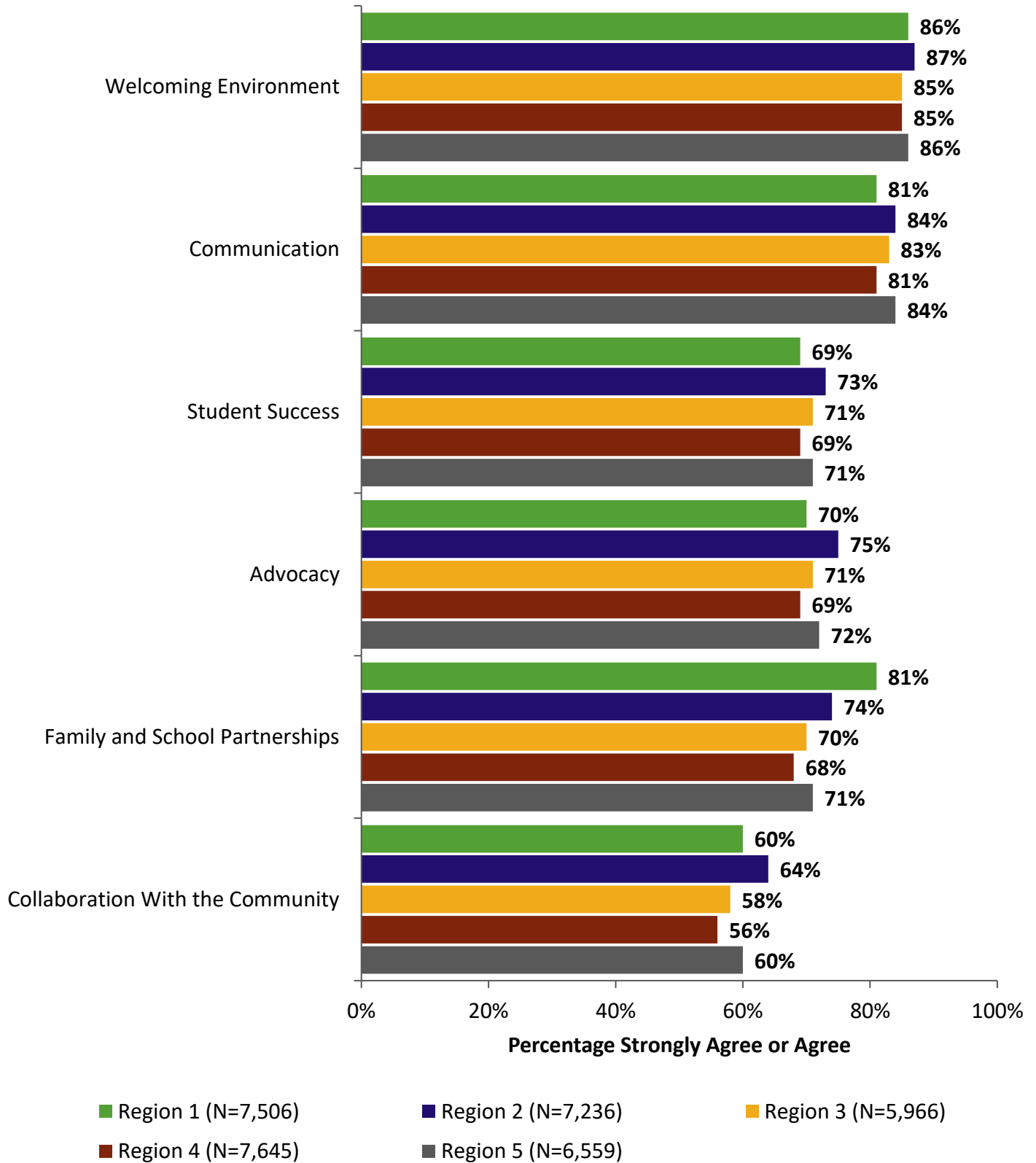


Does your child receive Advanced Academic Program (AAP) services? (N=33,863)



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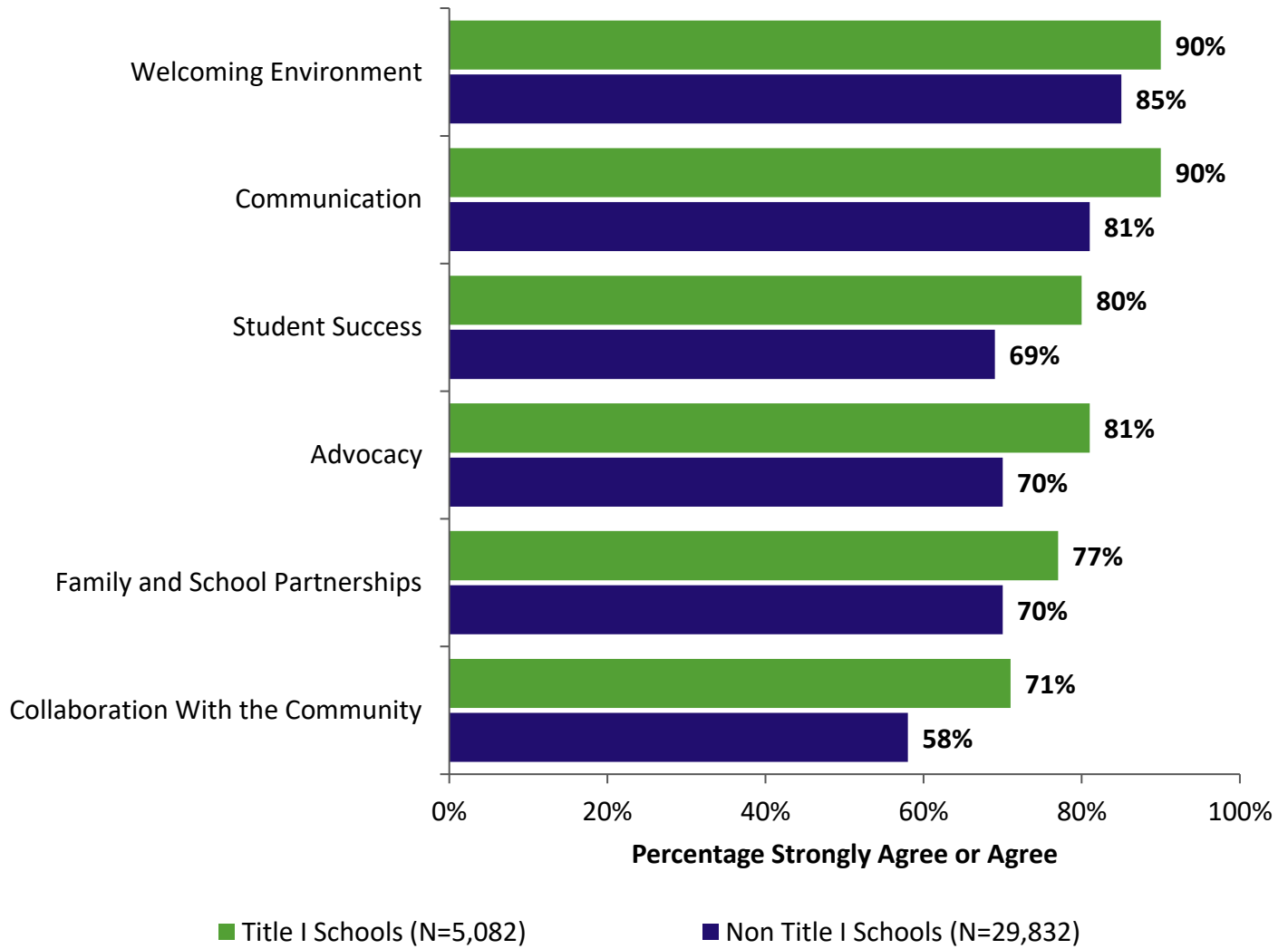
Dimension Scores by Region:
