PROPOSED SCOPE OF KENT GARDENS ES BOUNDARY STUDY

School Board Meeting June 26, 2023





Background

- Kent Gardens Elementary School (ES) has a substantial capacity deficit of 121% capacity utilization for SY 2022-23
 - The capacity deficit is projected to continue to SY 2027-28
- The FY2024-28 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) was adopted with an amendment by the School Board to include Kent Gardens ES for a priority recommended boundary/capacity study to be initiated in the spring of 2023
- Staff held a community boundary scoping meeting, as required and outlined in Regulation 8130, Local School Boundaries, Program Assignments, and School Closings
- The purpose of this scoping study is to identify which schools should be considered as part of the Kent Gardens ES boundary study





Summary of Feedback: Community Scoping

- Approximately 75 participants attended the April 26, 2023 community scoping meeting
- Online Feedback form was open two weeks following the meeting
 - 171 responses to the online feedback
- Feedback for Schools to be included:
 - More than 100 responses to include:
 - Chesterbrook ES
 - Franklin Sherman ES
 - Responses also included:
 - Haycock ES
 - Spring Hill ES
 - Lemon Road ES
 - Timber Lane ES
 - Westgate ES



Summary of Feedback: Community Scoping (cont'd)

- Major Feedback Themes:
 - Phasing should be included for students already at Kent Gardens
 - Consider that people move to neighborhoods in Kent Gardens boundary
 - Consider walking areas/proximity to school
 - Consider a lower/upper French Immersion program or School
 - Consider an additional French Immersion program at another school



Boundary Adjustment Process (Regulation 8130)

1. Community Meeting

- Boundary Scoping: The community is asked to suggest which schools and areas should be considered; may be done in advance of a Scope of Boundary Study presentation to the School Board.
- 2. Scope of Boundary Study Presentation: A scope of study for schools to be considered is presented to the School Board for approval.

3. Community Meeting(s)

- Boundary Study: Possible boundary change options are prepared by staff for consideration with the community and to collect feedback on the options.
- 4. School Board Meeting/New Business: Staff present a recommendation for a boundary adjustment to the School Board.
- 5. School Board Public Hearing: The School Board holds a Public Hearing on the boundary adjustment being considered.
- 6. School Board Meeting/Action: The School Board votes on a decision for the boundary adjustment.

Consideration

- Recommend that the boundary study scope include:
 - Chesterbrook ES, Churchill Road ES, Franklin Sherman ES, Kent Gardens ES, and Spring Hill ES be included in the boundary adjustment
 - Elementary AAP boundaries for those schools
 - Haycock ES AAP boundary
 - Churchill Road ES AAP boundary
- Consider including Middle and High Schools be included in the scope for options that may involve a split feeder



Additional Considerations and Discussion

Reservations on Recommending that the boundary study scope include:

Haycock ES School is approaching a capacity deficit.

Adding students may require capacity relief.

Lemon Road ES School is considered to have adequate capacity

for current programs and growth.

Adding students may require capacity relief.

Westgate ES School is considered to have adequate capacity

for current programs and growth.

Adding students may require capacity relief.

 Schools adjacent to Haycock ES, Lemon Road ES, and Westgate ES should be added to the scope if these are included.


