
The site provides **online interactive exercises** that guide users step by step through pre-writing, writing, organizing, editing, rewriting, and publishing.

Understanding the skills	Topic Sentence: a sentence that expresses the main idea of the paragraph in which it occurs.
	Body Paragraph: sentences that provide specific and different details about the topic.
	Conclusion:an ending sentence that restates the topic/main idea
	Revision: adding or subtracting words/details to improve writing
	Proofreading/Editing: checking my work for correct capitalization, punctuation, all my words, grammar, and spelling.
How to use?	Students can utilize this writing process throughout all of their writing assignments. Parents can provide additional prompts for their child to address in this format.
