Classroom Resources Grades 3 - 12 Student Interactive Organizing & Summarizing Circle Plot Diagram The Circle Plot Diagram can be used as a prewriting graphic organizer for students writing original stories with a circular plot structure as well as a postreading organizer used to explore the text structures in a book.
