

# College Success Program

The College Success Program (CSP) is comprised of four individual programs that support students who are traditionally underrepresented on college campuses. Many, but not all, CSP students are the first in their family to attend college. These programs prepare students for the academic rigors of college course work, help students navigate the college application process, and provide enrichment experiences to build resilience. Together, the programs promote college readiness by offering a variety of services that include: assistance with the college application process, field trips to college campuses, goal setting and career exploration, academic skill-building, and monitoring of academic performance.



*An enrichment program that supports students as they explore, apply, and enroll in college. Students attend monthly school-based meetings; and have the opportunity to visit colleges, explore careers, attend SAT prep courses, and a three-day summer college experience.*





*Through an elective class, students are prepared for college readiness and success in a global society. Instruction focuses on writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading strategies. Students participate in college, career, and cultural exploration activities, including field trips.*



*Two cohort programs sponsored in partnership with Northern Virginia Community College. One is a college and career readiness program; the other is a college transition program.*



*A multiyear program for first generation students sponsored in partnership with George Mason University (GMU). Students receive mentoring and attend workshops, math and science review days, and a three-week summer academy at GMU.*
