A note on transcriptions:

This work, while not an exact transcription, has been meticulously prepared to preserve the integrity and style of the original writing. Minimal additions of punctuation has been added for readability to include commas in lists, and periods in initials and abbreviations. Names of cities, towns and schools were written in the original text without uniformity, and some place names changed over time; the names of these places have been standardized within this text to include the spellings of Centreville, Dranesville, Falls Church and Mount Vernon. Original uses of abbreviations, capitalization, superscripts, and notations of “and” and currency have been unaltered. Names of all individuals who appear in this text have been researched, and if a discrepancy exists between the spelling of their name in the main text and in official records of the time period, a footnote has been included to inform researchers. Any indecipherable text has been notated with square brackets as to not unintentionally misspell or misrepresent a word or name. The line-by-line preparation was chosen to assist researchers in locating words in the original text.

In presenting the resolutions relative to  
Mr. W. S. Smoot's death

Bd. owes to itself to the public it serves  
and to the members of his family a recog-  
nition of his service.

Sherman was appt<sup>d</sup> to act in his place. The reading of minutes of last meeting was dispensed with. The following trustees were present. Jas. P. Machen, F. Sherman, R. W. Birch, R. G. Nevitt, Geo. W. Gunnell, J. A. Jenkins, W. J. French, E. H. Jones, E. L. Garrett, C. B. Cockrell & Dr. J. B. Gould. The Chairman stated the object of meeting was the appointment of a Committee (provided for by a recent resolution of the State board of Education) to select from a list of books to be adopted by State board, books for the schools of the county. The following Com. was appointed: Messrs J. P. Machen, F. Sherman, R. W. Birch, Teachers Dallas Berry, S. Ellis Davis & L. M. Milstead. The new school law was read & discussed as copies for the trustees were not ready for distribution.

A motion was made & carried that the Com. on text books be paid as much per diem as Com. to examine Treas. accts.

The Committee appointed to consider and recommend to the County School Board a basis for the Apportionment of the County School Fund for the year 1916-1917, having carefully considered the matter, report and recommend, as follows:

RESOLVED: (1) That to each of the School Districts in this County, there be first apportioned an amount which added to the State Fund apportioned to each District, will be sufficient to pay the salaries of teachers and charges for transportation of pupils for a term of eight (8) months for the white and seven (7) months for the Colored schools in the County;

(2) That a proper sum shall be reserved to meet the general and usual charges against the County School Fund, and to provide for the payment of teachers salaries, for the next school year, which become payable prior to receipt of the State Fund and

(3) That any and all surplus of the County Fund shall from time to time be apportioned and paid over to the several school districts in the same proportion that the entire tax assessed in the County, to wit" \$27,568.00 bears to the tax assessed in each District, PROVIDED that any District which shall have received an amount equal to, or in excess of its pro rata share of the County Taxes on such basis, by virtue of the appropriations under section one hereof, shall not participate in the apportionment [sic] of said surplus, and any apportionment of said surplus which would increase the aggregate amount received by any District to an amount in excess of its pro rata share as aforesaid shall be reduced as to such District or Districts, to the extent of such increase:
