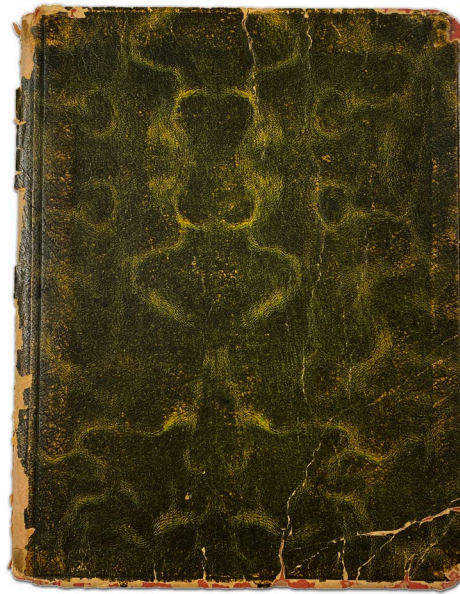

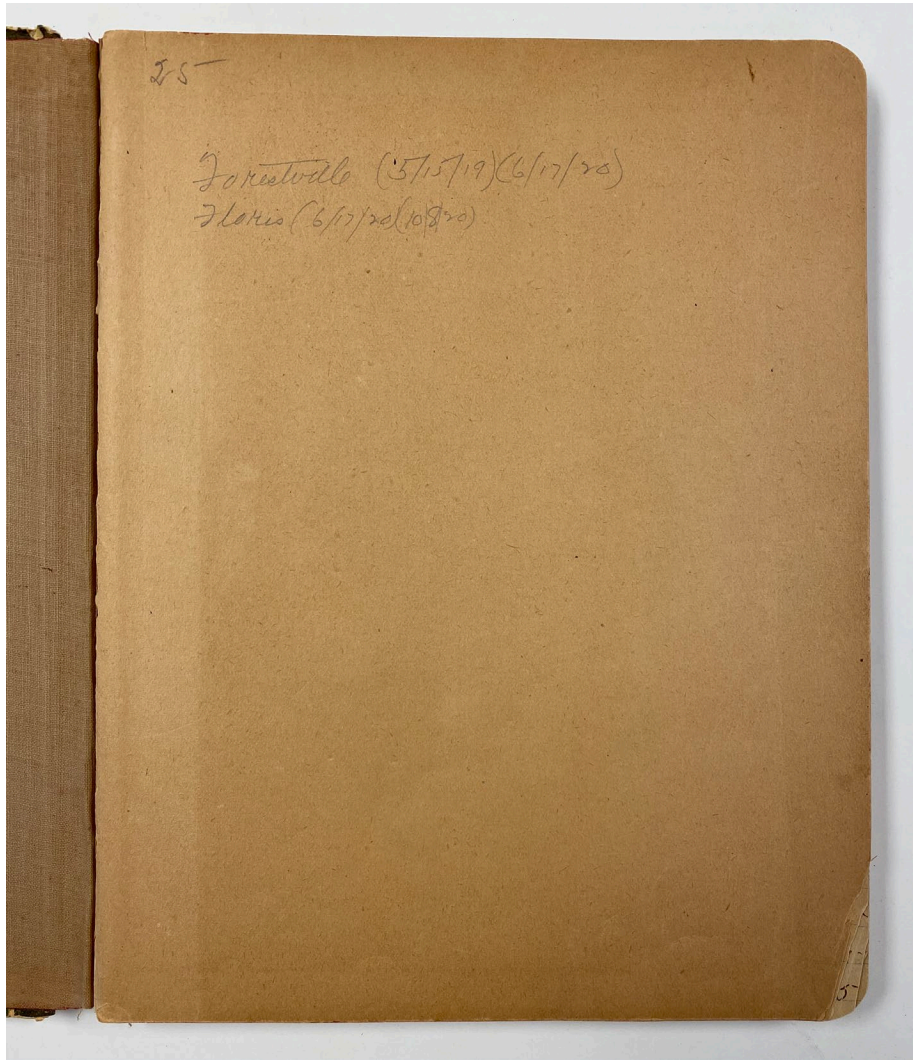

A note on transcriptions:

A line-by-line transcription has been prepared to preserve the integrity and style of the original writing. Modern usages of punctuation and capitalization have been used for the sake of readability. Names of schools were written without uniformity, either through clerk error or because the names of schools changed over time. This transcription has adopted the spellings of Cockrill, Forestville, Money's Corner, Powell's, Thornton's, and Wiehle, spellings which may not match the original writing in every instance but will assist researchers by providing standardization of spelling. Capitalization of school names have also been standardized in this transcription, appearing as Vale School House, Vale School, or School No. 1. Shorthand symbols, unconventional abbreviations, and the various notations of money have been altered, and names, many in abbreviated form as was the fashion of the time period, have been transcribed as they appear with only the addition of necessary punctuation for consistency.

The Dranesville District School Trustees met at Forestville Colored <sup>School</sup> House, Jan. 6, 1912. W<sup>m</sup> H. Fox and J. P. Tucker present. The object of this meeting was to sell the colored school house, which was sold to Geo. C. Johnson for the sum of \$455.<sup>00</sup>

Lewis Hunt also appears in the text as Lewis J. Hunt, Luis J. Hunt and Lewis J. Hunt. The historical records show the surname as Hunt.

Ed Wynkook is likely C.E. Wynkook on page 22. Historical records show the name as Charles E. Wynkoop.

Forestville School is spelled throughout this text as Forrestville, Forestvill and Forestville. For consistency and to assist researchers, the school's name has been standardized in this text as Forestville. Please refer to the clerk's text for the original spelling.

Willie Walker also appears as William Walker in the text.

Wiehle School, named after the Wiehle family (more information found in the previous Dranesville Minute Book) is spelled throughout this text as both Wiehle and Weihle. For consistency and to assist researchers, the school's name has been standardized in this text as Wiehle. Please refer to the clerk's text for the original spelling.

Mathew Middleton is Matthew Middleton in the historic record.
