Descriptive Statement: Instruction will include identifying the positive aspects of social media and text messaging; the misuse of social media and text messaging including the consequences of engaging in cyberbullying and sexually explicit communication (sexting); ~~and~~ strategies for appropriate use of technology; and strategies for responding to/dealing with inappropriate online communication.

7.6 Students will identify appropriate and inappropriate personal and social use of technology.

Instruction will include the role that technology plays in education, relationships, and social interactions. Potential long term health, academic, career, and criminal consequences of engaging in sexually explicit communication will be emphasized. Sexually explicit communication including sexually explicit shared/posted images and videos of minors, whether or not consented to, may be considered child pornography. Strategies for responding to/dealing with inappropriate online communication will be included.
