A note on transcriptions:

A line-by-line transcription has been prepared to preserve the integrity and style of the original writing. Modern usage of punctuation and capitalization have been utilized for the sake of readability. Falls Church School Board appears in various forms of capitalization; for consistency this transcription has capitalized all iterations throughout, but maintained abbreviations as they appear in the original text. Names of schools, likewise, were written without any uniformity and appear in this transcription in capitals for full school names (i.e.: No. 1, West End School or West End Schoolhouse), with the spellings of "schoolhouse" being adopted throughout and not broken into two words.


Shorthand versions of "and" in the form of plus signs instead of ampersands have been preserved, and the various notations of money have been unaltered. Many names appear in abbreviated form, as was the fashion at the turn of the century, and have been transcribed as they appear with only the addition of necessary punctuation for consistency; names written in full have been researched for correct spelling and are used in this text to create as accurate an account as possible.

Dec. 13, 1897. Meeting of Sch. Board at Ilda The contractor for building house was paid in full \$100 for work, also other bills for work on house and lot. O. G. Besley paid for frame, and house accepted by the School Board, and Miss Pearl Howard appointed as teacher to qualify as soon as house is furnished. Mr. Caton agreed to furnish wood for school for \$2 per month and received \$1\frac{70}{2}\$ on a/c in left over material from sch. house.

Aug. 28, 1900

District School Board met at Courthouse and organized by electing Wm. J. Malone as Chairman, and R. W. Birch as Clerk. After statement of Birch as to condition of schools + houses it was decided to build house for colored school at Mt. Pleasant, and Clerk ordered to prepare specifications and advertise for bids. A partial list of teachers was elected for the ensueing [sic] term and Clerk directed to notify them to meet Board at West End, Sep. 29, to sign contracts +c.

Mr. Cockrell asking permission to fill vacancy at No. 3 was allowed same. There being but 1 bid for new house and Board judging it excessive allowed Mr. Cleaveland 3 days to put in bid Sept. 15.

Board met at R. W. B. and accepted Cleaveland's bid for new house at \$495— complete.

Bessie L. Riddick was a respected teacher in Fairfax County's African-American community. Several articles in the *Alexandria Gazette* mention her teaching in Alexandria as well as her death notice in 1919 – she was 41 years old.

Richard Southern "R. S." Shreve, Jr. taught at the schools for white children in Bailey's Crossroads and Merrifield. His parents, the Reverend and Mrs. Richard Southern Shreve, Sr., were killed by lightning in 1874 in their home while standing near a window conducting a prayer service with their family. No other family members were injured. Probate notices in the newspaper show Richard Jr. was still an infant. He was raised by his grandparents.

District School Board met at R. W. Birch's and organized by motion of Mr. Cockrell. W. H. Shreve was made Chairman and R. W. Birch, Clerk. Bills and a/c of Dist. Fund were ex. and discussed after which the Board reappointed Miss Wiley, Miss Hagan, Miss Beattie, white teachers; Miss Holiday, Miss Riddick + Mr. Hyson, col. Petition was presented asking for W. T. Heistand as teacher at Linconia, and after much discussion the Board adopted resolutions asking Supt. to revoker [sic] or not issue license to said Heistand, resenting the manner in which he has treated Trustees + other teachers. Board agreed to open a school at Howardville. Delayed further business for a conference with Supt.

R. W. Birch.

William Thompson "W. T." Heistand was born in Ohio and the family was in the Fairfax area only a short time. It appears he tried his hand at the newspaper business and when he couldn't make a go of it, he resorted to teaching. He taught at Sweetnam (an earlier name for Fairfax Station), and his wife was an organist at Lincolnia Episcopal Chapel. The family moved to Buffalo. NY. Mr. Heistand died in 1921 in NY.

The School Board said the letter was ungentlemanly and unkind to teacher and determined in the best interest of the school not to give him the school for the coming session 1904-1905, for which he applied to Mr. Cockrell, one of the Board.

Mr. Hall called the roll of petitioners and those present

Mr. Hall called the roll of petitioners and those present answered to their names, were sworn and examined by him annent [sic] this controversy for which the meeting was called. Mr. Howdershell wanted Heistand for teacher for ensuing year and that he should get the school for evening classes for the large boys. Mr. Lewis said he wished for harmony of school would have liked Heistand for teacher; has six children school age, but now thought that the divided sentiment in the community indicated that it would not be wise to appoint him. Mr. Hall at this time read the letter under controversy for the informa -tion of those giving testimony.

Mr. J. F. Laing said with Mr. Howdershell he got up the petition for night school.

Mr. Heistand. He wanted a good arithmetic teacher; has two children.

Mr. W. J. Baliss signed two petitions; wanted Heistand for teacher but now thinks otherwise, it would not be for harmony.

Mr. Redmon has one child; signed two peititions in favor of Heistand on a/c of his qualifications, but now thinks he should not get school because of divided sentiment.

Mr. Heistand called for school key at house where Miss Stephenson lived and was told that it was under a brick at school door laught [sic] one evening, but was afterward refused key by teacher who went to see School Board who approved her course. He did not know whether fuel + oil would be found or school

kept clean. Heistand stated that he took his oil from school after this. But, though Miss Stephenson to ignore him, he showed all courtesy toward her. Mr. Laing got up petition on my behalf for coming year. I said I would take the school if desired by the patrons. Mr. Heistand defended his letter to Miss Stephenson which was the cause of the controversy.

The School Board, having been put on oath, Mr. Birch, Clerk of Board, said they had no application from Heistand as a Board for the Lincolnia School for the coming year Mr. Birch handed Mr. Hall a written statement giving reasons why they did not give Heistand the school - this was read to the meeting. Mr. Shreve said he concurred in Mr. Birch action in the matter. Mr. Cockrell said he got no letter from Heistand applying for the school, it was only verbal.

Mrs. Manchester, at whose house the teacher lived, did not think it well to give Heistand the school.

Mrs. Manchester said teacher would not give any one responsibility, went to Mr. Birch about it. Mrs. Carter does not think that Heistand is the proper person for the school, would not send her child to him. Mr. Heistand in a rebuttal defended his action in letter to Miss Stephenson, also his envolvement [sic] of school at Ilda. Mr. Heistand ignorrd [sic] School Board when they refused to answer his letters. He failed to return register because he did not receive blank book. Mr. Hall said that publishers at Richmond were at falt [sic]. Heistand said he would send register to Hall when completed. Mr. Shreve said Heistand manifested malice toward Board. At conclusion, Mr. Hall gave good advice as to the future of school at Lincolnia, to

present to retire for a few minutes until the Secratary [sic] decide about the matter. The meeting being called again the Secretary stated that they concluded to support the action of the School Board regretting that one so well equipped + fitted to teach as Heistand should be lost to the community. At ^ meeting of Dist. Sch. Bd., July 29, after appointing teachers and other routine business, Mr. Cockrell moved that we appropriate \$800 to build schoolhouse near Seminary, that said money be used at the discresion [sic] of a committee of three, one being a school trustee: Mrs. Andrews, Mr. Howard, and Birch, trustee. That any questions arising that are not satisfactory to the full committee is to be submitted to School Board for their determination. The following teachers were appointed: No. 1 Miss Cowling, No. 2 Miss Battie, No. 3 Miss Anderson, No. 4 Miss King, No. 5 Miss Lelia Beattie, No 6. Miss J. H. Winn No. 7 Miss Stephenson, No. A Louise Thornton, B Lil Hopkins, No. C T. W. Hyson, No. D Bessie Riddick, No. E to be supplied. There was no change made in salaries of last year.

Vauxcluse, also seen as Vaucluse, was a plantation home in Alexandria, first owned by Dr. James Craik, a surgeon in the Virginia Regiment and the Continental Army, and later by Thomas Fairfax, 9th Lord Fairfax of Cameron. The home was destroyed during the Civil War. Professor and Mrs. Andrews (a committee member named above) rebuilt Vauxcluse on the original property around 1902; the home was often mentioned as a place of events in the Alexandria and Washington society pages.

The following arrangement was agreed upon by Charles M. Robinson, Architect, and the Falls Church Dist. School Board.


That Chas. M. Robinson agrees to prepare the necessary original plans and specifications for a brick and concrete school building in West End, Alexandria, Fairfax County, Va., fifty by thirtysix feet, and to supervise in his own proper person or a competent representative the construction of the same. Said supervision to consist of weekly visits to and full inspection of the work as the same progresses. 2nd) The said Chas. M. Robinson, Archt., further agrees to make such further drawings and descriptions to the original drawings and specifications as may be necessary to explain the same, and when visiting the work to make such verbal explanations

as the contractor may request.
3d) This said C. M. Robison, Archt., further agrees to carefully inspect all material to be used in said building, to see that the same be first class in every particular.

4th) In consideration of the foregoing, the Falls Church Dist. Sch. Bd. agrees to pay the said Chas. M. Robinson for the service set out in this agreement in such amts and such manner as follows: two per centum of the amt of each contract when the same has been properly executed and awarded, and three per centum of all payments made to any and all contractors until the full amt. of five per centum on all contract work has been fully paid.

Charles M. Robinson (1867-1932) designed many public school buildings throughout Virginia. The public schools he designed in Fairfax County included the Bailey's Crossroads School, the Franklin Sherman School, the Forestville School, the first Herndon High School, and the West End School. He may have also designed the Clifton High School, the Floris Vocational High School, and the first Oakton High School.






