## Inova Fairfax Hospital Visit

100 students from Falls Church Academy Exploring Health Science and Medical Assisting classes visited Inova Fairfax Hospital for a day long medical mentoring experience! During the event, students participated in a variety of different experiences and learned how:

- Back surgeries are done with orthopedic surgeons
- Tracheostomy tubes are put in with respiratory specialists
- VR and AI simulations are used in medical training in the Inova Healthcare System
- Arterial sticks are done using a phlebotomy/arterial arm
- To take blood pressures and hear heart and lung sounds from UVA Medical students

In addition to the hands-on learning, students ate lunch and conversed with medical professionals who gave great advice to the students at their table and shared their career and life pathways.

#### **FBLA**

The Northern Virginia Region of FBLA held their Regional Leadership Conference at Edison High School. Over 650 students competed in 74 events ranging from Accounting and Business Ethics to Digital Animation and Networking Infrastructures. Students took objective tests, skills tests, gave presentations and created programs to compete in the wide variety of events. That afternoon, over 200 FCPS students took the stage and were awarded first, second or third place medals in recognition of their hard work and achievements. Of those winners, more than 150 have now qualified to compete in the FBLA State Leadership Conference which will be held in Reston on April 12 and 13.

In addition to the competitions, the FBLA Regional Officer Elections were also held during the conference. FBLA members from Edison, Chantilly, Robinson, and Westfield were elected and installed to lead the Northern Virginia Region of FBLA for the 2024 – 2025 school year.
