Health and Medical Science

ER Rotation!

Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) students from Falls Church Academy began their ER rotation and ride-a-longs! In partnership with Inova Fair Oaks Emergency Department and Fairfax County Fire and Rescue, EMT students gain experience and patient contacts while monitoring patient's challenges. Students witnessed cardiac issues, lacerations, broken bones, complications with pregnancies, mental challenges, anaphylaxis and more. One student mentioned, "It's interesting how smoothly everyone worked together with a common language." Another student received high praise from a patient who said "you are going to do so great in this field" as our student held her hand and talked to her as she was being cared for. Another student matter of factly stated "I can really see myself here!" These experiences help our students take the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) exam. What a great learning experience!

Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy

Chantilly Academy's Physical Therapy/Occupational Therapy students took a field trip to NOVA's Medical Education Campus (MEC) where they made a stop at the phlebotomy lab.



Biotechnology Foundation

Falls Church Academy students in the Biotechnology Foundations program observe milk and yogurt while proving that it is the presence of bacteria in the yogurt that causes the milk to become yogurt. Observational and reporting skills that students have learned in this class are used to discover and record their findings.

Emergency Response Protocols

Individuals from the Fairfax County Community Emergency Response Team provided a weeklong training program designed specifically for high school students in which they prepared the Falls Church Academy EMT students to be disaster ready and able to provide assistance if necessary. Students learned disaster preparedness and CERT organization, disaster psychology, terrorism, medical one & two, light search and rescue, utility control and fire safety. Each day students were given knowledge checks to confirm their understanding.

Medical Assistant Classes

To learn about wound care, you have to first have a wound, right? Students in the Medical Assistant classes had fun creating various simulated wounds on mannequins and then assessed them and learned how to manage their healing. Wounds were assessed for their length, depth, proliferation, and inflammation and in the assessment, students described them using medical terms. They also described the type of dressing or sutures the wounds needed as well as wound care and healing nutrition.

Criminal Justice Students

The students in the Criminal Justice Level 1 classes had the opportunity to gain experience and practice for the Stop the Bleed training with members of the Inova Trauma Services team by packing the wound, using pressure and tourniquets.

911 Dispatch

Students in the 911 Dispatch Course are participating in the Department of Public Safety Communication (DPSC) Sit-Along Career Shadow Program. Throughout March and April students will shadow a 911 Dispatch Operator listening to actual calls in real time and observe how each call is managed and recorded. Students will complete a total of 8 hours through this shadow program.

Emergency Medical Technician

West Potomac Academy EMT students took a dual trip to the Department of Public Safety Communication (DPSC) and the Fairfax Fire Academy. At DPSC, students learned to use the radio operations system and participated in an EMT Scenarios. At the Fire Academy, students watched current academy students acting out a scenario of a traffic accident and went inside the burn building. Both



facilities offered tours and shared information about their programs, departments, education, and employment opportunities.

Explore Futuristic Learning

The 45-foot bus, or Immersive Learning Center (ILC), educational program from the George Washington University School of Medicine & Health Sciences and Medi-Corps Program, aimed at helping high school students explore careers in the healthcare field, visited West Potomac Academy for the week of March 18-22! Health and Medical Science students climbed aboard the giant blue bus parked outside West Potomac Academy and entered a futuristic world of learning focused on exploring the intricacies of the human body. Augmented reality, artificial intelligence (AI), and holograms are all being used to give FCPS medical science students the chance to get hands-on experience in a virtual setting.

Clinical Shadows

Medical Assisting Students are participating in Clinical Shadows with Inova Ambulatory Services Specialty Clinics. Students spend a day shadowing a Medical Assistant in an Inova Clinical Specialty of their choice. Participating Inova Clinics: Inova Occupational Health, OBGYN, Schar Cancer Institute, and Neurosurgery.
